

Planned Use of the School Sports Premium 2018 – 2019

The Government has confirmed its continuing investment in primary sport with the allocation of £320 million in 2018/19 to continue to improve physical education and sport in primary schools. Each primary school will continue to receive a flat amount of £16,000 plus £5 per pupil aged 5 and over at the last Pupil Census. At Wootton Primary, the Sport Premium is allowing us to continue to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and skills, driving the professional development of the teaching team through investing in a sports specialist teacher who draws upon the services of the specialist sports provider on the Island throughout the year. The aim is to build a sustainable capacity within the school rather than buy in services which may then cease if funding is no longer available. This will ensure continuity of high-quality teaching across the whole school. We will ensure that all children are given a range of opportunities to engage in and additional Change4Life sports clubs, including access to competitive sports. Living on an Island we consider swimming a critical life-skill and our school funded swimming programme takes place in Year 3 and continued in Year 6 for any child that is unable to swim unaided.
