Dear Parents,

On Monday many of our children represented the PEACH games held over in West Wight. The games are designed for children who would not normally access competitive sport, giving them opportunity to have a go at different sports. I have received so much positive feedback regarding the children both for their participation and behaviour. This was noted by all our staff but also staff from other schools. Well done and thank you to all the children involved and also to the staff who supported Mr Billington with this.

Also this week our Year 5 and 6 children had the opportunity to attend the Noel Turner Science Festival which is joined with the Winchester Science Centre at Cowes Enterprise College. The children had an incredible day and again were excellent representatives of the school, well done everyone.

In our celebration assembly today we congratulated Theodore in Year 3 who was awarded the Under 8s Coach's Player of the Season for Vectis Rugby Club. Henry in Year 5 was also awarded a medal for his contributions to the Under 11s team. Owen shared with us his football medal from taking part in a tournament on the mainland, Sadie in Year 4 showed her rosette from taking part in a pet competition; her dog was given 5th place for the waggiest tail! Elliott and Spencer in Year 4 have been awarded the Chief Scout Bronze Award and Daisy in Year 2 shared 3 swimming certificates and a gymnastic achievement certificate. Year 1 children also received a certificate from Red Funnel for their contributions to the artwork for the Isle of Wight Festival. We also congratulated our Under 11 girls cricket team who were the runners up in the Island final yesterday. This is an incredible achievement and we are so very proud of all the girls and Mr Billington! Please see the sports news section for more details.

We also congratulated our Numbots winners for this week - 1st place Daisy in Year 2, 2nd place Sebby in Year 2, 3rd place Daisy in Year 1, 4th place Harry M in Year 1 and 5th place Cassie also in Year 1 - well done to you all. Our top 5 TTRS, the children who have earned the most coins over the last 7 days are - 1st place Gabrielle in Year 6, 2nd place Evan in Year 3, 3rd place Koby in Year 4, 4th place Scarlett in Year 6 and 5th place Evie in Year 3 - great work, keep it up! We also heard from each teacher as to why they have chosen their Star Pupils, well done everyone.

I look forward to working with families this afternoon and tomorrow morning for the Mardi Gras workshops. Next Saturday the event takes place and it will be wonderful to see lots of children watching. The parade will leave Simeon Rec in Ryde at 3pm via Westhill Road, moving through Union Street and past Eastern Gardens on the return to the Rec. Please give us a shout as we go past!. Children taking part, please ensure you have returned your permission slip by next Wednesday and that you still attend Carnival club on Monday to practice the dancing and collect your costume, thank you.

If you are having a clear out at all we are on the look out for some donations. Should you have any of the

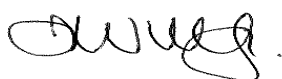

Unfortunately, we continue to have ongoing problems with the drains! Following on from some camera work this week we have discovered wipes are being flushed down the toilets causing blocks. You may have seen the recent press release regarding the launch of the latest project from the connect4communities scheme, providing food vouchers to eligible households in receipt of Local Council Tax Support. WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have had another busy week in Year 1! In English we have finished our book, 'George's Marvellous Medicine', and the children have been busy retelling the story and writing a book review. In Maths, we have continued with multiplication and have been making arrays and trying to describe how many rows and columns the array has. We have continued with our topic about 'The Seaside'. We discussed the different features that we might see at the beach and then sorted them into human or physical features. We also enjoyed our RSE Day where we celebrated how unique we all are and what makes us sparkle!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Year 2 we have looked at the book 'Vlad and The Great fire of London'. From reading this book, we have created a range of possessive apostrophe sentences and have then linked this into a short diary writing piece. In Maths, we have focussed on symmetry and, using mirrors, we have identified symmetry in shapes and letters. We have also completed a recap of multiplication and reinforced links to our knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s as well as division. Alongside this, we have created flags to celebrate our differences, we have looked at tempo in music and used it to write our own pieces of music and we have looked at the reasons why the fire in London in 1666 spread so quickly.

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In English this week we wrote a letter to a character in our story, persuading him to come home. We used persuasive techniques, paragraphs and adverbs in our letters. We spent some time editing the letters by improving the vocabulary and changing spelling and punctuation. In Maths we continued to work on addition and subtraction, focusing on missing number problems. We practised using a range of resources and methods to help us. In Geography we learned about the different types of settlements and land uses. We used maps to help us decide how the land is used in Wootton. On Thursday we learned about 'celebrating differences'. We thought carefully about what makes us all unique and special and we discussed the importance of treating everyone fairly.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP

This week in Year Four we have been learning about factor pairs in Maths, using our times table knowledge to explore what we know about factors and products and then tackling reasoning tasks. In English, the children blew us away with their persuasive writing - we pretended to be mercenaries, seeking employment with Podkin as a bodyguard to defend him against The Gorm. The children used repetition for effect, emotive language, exaggeration and rhetorical questions to be as persuasive as possible - watch out for their refined persuasive skills! In Art, the children have sketched some Newtown landscapes, and in Geography we gathered information about Newtown. This week some children have also been lucky enough to enjoy a Bikeability session or a PEACH Games event, so it has been a busy week!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 5 had an exciting day on Thursday visiting Cowes Enterprise College for the Noel Turner STEM Expo. The day began with students touring the different exhibits. From careers in STEM to current problems and solutions in the realm of science, there was no shortage of interesting topics to explore. Later, we watched a show about gases and the children found this very interesting and exciting, especially when the scientist showed us how to turn dry ice (the solid form of carbon dioxide) into a cup launcher! They also saw how liquid nitrogen will instantly freeze objects! The day ended with a workshop where the children were challenged to use an empty 2L bottle and some Kinects to make a space rover. I was very impressed with the amount of teamwork our students exhibited as they dove into this challenge! They were outstanding representatives of Wootton Primary School.

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Year 6, the children all designed and created their own maths based games, using all of their knowledge and mathematical concepts that they have gained this year! We have seen board games, investigation games and turn-based games being created, using a wide range of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division questions, as well as the challenges of ratio and algebra! In English, Year 6 are carrying on and completing their individual writing projects and some of the writing that has been produced is simply superb! We have started preparation work for the Year 6 leavers service and we all shared some wonderful memories together that Year 6 have remembered throughout their time at Wootton - be prepared for a range of wonderful and weird tales. We also enjoyed our day at the Noel Turner Science Festival, where we all learnt and saw so much - who knew working with gasses was so fun! Really well done Year 6, another superb week of learning, just in time for your residential next week :)

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class we have been busy with our dinosaur topic, and each day we are trying to learn a new fact. We have been recapping these each day and the children have learnt some great facts already. We are busy writing these facts down and are trying to be as independent as we possibly can. Number bonds is still a big focus and we have used the dinosaurs to help us with our work. We found another frog this week so put it in our special pot for a couple of days so we could get a close look at it. We have also visited Year 1 again and met our new teacher ahead of going into year 1.

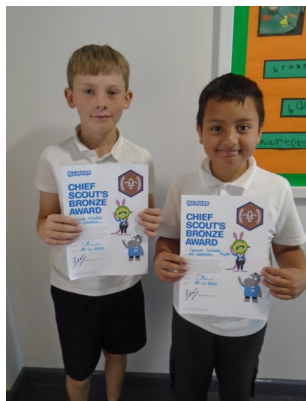

PEACH Games:

On Monday we took part in an incredible event held at West Wight Sports Centre in Freshwater. The PEACH Games are organised by School Games Mark (our PE accreditation and competition organisers) and the Isle of Wight Council. It is designed to showcase how amazing sport and being active is and improve the wellbeing of children. The children attending, mostly, were those that haven't represented the school or choose not to sign up to sporting after school clubs. Wootton was fortunate to secure two teams in separate events, which allowed children from Years 3, 4 and 5 to attend.

Our first team of 6 girls and 7 boys from 3 and 4 took part in a football and handball tournament. In the morning the team played football against 4 other schools. Boys played the first half and girls the second half. Quick, energetic games followed and our team did incredibly well. Several children scored, many great saves were made and most importantly everyone had fun. After lunch they tried handball for the first time. By watching the first game we learnt the rules. Again the boys competed the first half and the girls took over in the second half. Both teams quickly picked up the rules and worked out that moving quickly and being in space was really important. Everyone played extremely well, but some star performances from Sadie M and Freddie T particularly stood out.

Our other team took part in a very different sort of sports competition. Their activities included New Age Kurling, Boccia and Archery, all of which had been adapted to enable disabled athletes the chance to compete.

First up was New Age Kurling and the children quickly learnt the finesse needed to accurately roll the kurling discs to target. Next was archery, which proved to be the most popular event of the day with some of the team scoring bullseyes! Finally the team finished with Boccia, a sport similar to Boule and Petanque, and Wootton proved particularly adept. Lots of careful consideration of weight and direction meant that Wootton often ended up with several scoring balls.

Well done to Kurtis M, Harley L, Evie L, Kristen L, Sonny E, Jay E and Jack B from Year 3; Layla W, Jess T, Evie-May N, Freddie T, Jacob R, Sadie M, Thea C and Chloe W from Year 4; Finn H, Charlie S, Archie R, and Yasemin P from Year 5. You were a pleasure to take to the PEACH Games and were a credit to the school.

U11 Girls Cricket Final:

Our Year 5 and 6 girls travelled to Arreton Cricket Club yesterday afternoon to compete in the U11 Girls' final. Reaching the final was already an incredible achievement having outperformed 20 other schools. The opposition were Newchurch and we could see that they would be a tough challenge. Newchurch won the toss (rock, paper, scissors) and elected to field. This meant Wootton would need to set a good total for them to chase down. Wootton started slowly, but grew in confidence throughout their innings. Newchurch fielded and took their catches well which meant we lost 3 wickets along the way. We ended up on 237 runs for 3 wickets. When bowling and fielding Wootton used the skills they'd learnt all season. The bowling was the best I've seen all season, we were accurate and challenged their batters. The fielders stopped crucial runs and were always ready for action.

Despite our efforts Wootton ended up on the losing side. Newchurch finished on 265 runs for 1 wicket.

I have never been prouder of a team at Wootton. As I said in assembly today, from having only 2 people in the team and begging people to play, to having a team in the final and the capability of winning is incredible. I hope it inspires the team to continue with sport and also inspires others to have a go at something new!

Dear Parent/Carer

Transition Taster Days – Tuesday 12th and Wednesday 13th July 2022

The time is fast approaching for your child to get ready for their next step in education, when they join Ryde Academy in September 2022.

We think it is important for students to start thinking about transition early so that they are ready for school in September. As part of this we are inviting all Year 6 students who will be joining us in September 2022 to our school for two days in July.

This is a great opportunity for the students to familiarise themselves with the building and meet our staff and students. They will be together for the first time in their new tutor group, where they will spend the two days doing activities together. We will be in touch closer to the transition days to let you know who will be your child's tutor.

Outline of the days

- Students should arrive via the Pellhurst Road entrance (by the Zebra Crossing) by 8:45am. Students will then make their way to the courts. Their tutor for next year will be there to meet and greet the students and direct them where to go.
- They should wear their primary school PE kit, with their primary school jumper over the top.
- Students will have a 30 minute morning break and a 40-minute lunch break.
- At 2:50pm they will be dismissed from the Pellhurst Road gate.

Please provide students with a suitable snack and a drink (preferably a water bottle they can refill) for morning break, and either a packed lunch or money to buy food in the canteen at lunch time. If they are in receipt of free school meals, we will provide the students with a meal at lunch time.

On Wednesday 13th July at 3:00pm we would like to invite parents and carers with their child to meet the tutors. This will be an opportunity for you to meet face to face with your child's tutor and for you to ask any questions. Should you not be able to attend this session, please get in touch and we will arrange an alternative for you.

Summer Reading Challenge 2022

Dear Parents and Carers

The national curriculum for English aims to ensure that pupils develop the habit of reading widely and often for both pleasure and information.

Organised by charity The Reading Agency (www.readingagency.org.uk) and the UK public library network since 1999, the **Summer Reading Challenge** is the UK's biggest annual reading promotion for children aged 4 to 11.

The Summer Reading Challenge combines **FREE** access to books with fun, creative activities during the summer holidays. Throughout the Challenge, library staff and young volunteers support the children, helping them to discover new authors and illustrators and to explore a wide range of different types of books and ways of reading.

How the Challenge works

- Children sign up through their local library and receive a Gadgeteers collector poster.
- Children set a reading goal and borrow and read library books of their own choice during the summer, collecting special stickers to complete their poster and extra incentives along the way.
- Library staff and volunteers are on hand to advise and run family-friendly activities.
- Children who complete the Summer Reading Challenge are presented with a certificate and/or a medal.

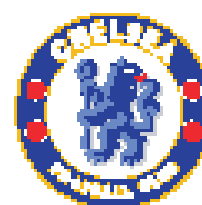
