Thank you so much to all of the parents who supported their children at one of the Mardi Gras workshops last week. We are really looking forward to performing on Saturday and hope to see lots of familiar faces in the crowd - give us a shout as we pass!

The children thoroughly enjoyed our guest children's author Simon Murray on Monday and the younger children all had a workshop learning how to draw the main character from the books Icky Doo Dah. It was wonderful to listen to the children being thoroughly engaged and enthused to learn. Year 4 were also lucky enough to have local author (and Wootton parent) Kieran Larwood join them to talk about his writing process and where his ideas come from. The children were so interested to hear about his career and it definitely inspired some budding authors!

We also had a visit from the local Church this week, who worked very hard to raise funds for the school following lockdown. Harry Kirby presented the children with a cheque for over £1000 to help support learning across the school. We are so very grateful for the work they have done to raise these funds and will be putting it towards updating our reading books and encouraging reading for pleasure for all pupils. A huge thank you from all of us at Wootton!

In our celebration assembly today we congratulated Jacob from Year 3 who has earned a medal for Beach Football, Alife S from Year 3 who has been awarded a medal for Rugby and Amira from Reception who has made her Rainbows promise. Well done all of you for your achievements outside of school! We also heard from each teacher as to why they have chosen their Star Pupils, well done everyone.

We are really looking forward to our transition days next week and hope that our Year 6 children have a great experience at High School. Please drop off your child at their usual classroom in the morning. We are holding parent presentations in your child's new class from 9:00—9:30am on both Tuesday 12th and Wednesday 13th. Please come along to either meeting to hear a little more about your child's new year group and meet their teacher if you are able. I'm sure you can appreciate how much thought goes into the placement of all members of staff across the school to meet the needs of all pupils effectively. We are very excited about the team that has been put together and look forward to getting started in September. Transition booklets are attached at the end of the newsletter for each class.

On Thursday 14th Year 6 will be running our Key Stage 1 sports event with Key Stage 2 competing on Friday. If your child would like to wear a coloured T-shirt for their House they are very welcome to. **Please remember, all Reception and Key Stage 1 children will need to wear their PE kits on Thursday and Key Stage 2 on Friday.** There will be no other PE days now for the rest of the term so full uniform must be worn every day unless told differently by your child's class teacher, thank you. Sports Day starts at 1pm on both of these days and parents are welcome to come and watch.

Talking of uniform, in September if your child wants to wear a white sports PE top as opposed to a white T-shirt or polo top then they are welcome to do so.

We have had a Level 2 heatwave warning for next week so please just remember those water bottles, sun hats and to apply sun cream before school. We will endeavour to keep the classrooms cool and the children in the shade where possible.

You may have seen the recent press release regarding the launch of the latest project from the connect4communities scheme, providing food vouchers to eligible households in receipt of Local Council Tax Support. Vouchers are being offered to households in receipt of the benefit that also meet one of the following criteria:

- In receipt of Pension Credit Guaranteed Credit
- In receipt of benefits-related Free School Meals / EYPP
- Have no children or pensioners living in the house

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have had another busy week in Year 1! In English we have started our book, 'Queen Victoria's Bathing Machine', and the children have been busy retelling the story and designing our own bathing machine. In Maths, we have continued with making arrays and have also started looking at quarter, half and full turns. We have also been focusing on our RSE topic. We have looked at how to look after babies, what babies need and who helps us as we grow up.

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week we in Year 2 we have been busy. In English, we have finished and polished off our diary writing using our purple pens to show the editing and changes we need to make. In Maths, we have been refining our knowledge of position and direction. We have recapped a lot of the key vocabulary for the unit and applied it to patterns and problems through the week. The children have really enjoyed the chance to take their learning outside when we used chalk on the playground. We have also had some very good discussions about growing and changing using scientific vocabulary to help us with our learning. In History, we have redesigned London after the fire and talked about the changes we would make and the reasons why. The piece was a great opportunity for the children to show what they had learnt this term. We have also looked at food chains and used paper strips to help us visualise the concept.

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have had another busy week in Year 3 this week! In English we planned and wrote a set of instructions about how to save a turtle. We thought carefully about adding lots of detail and adverbs to our instructions. In Maths we are learning about money. We started by adding groups of coins and notes together to find the total. Then we tried to make totals in different ways, using different coins. After this, we practised giving change from £1 and £5. In Art we painted our clay sculptures, using Gaudi's work as our inspiration. In Geography, we thought about the land uses in Newchurch and compared this to Wootton. We drew a map to show how land is used in our local area.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP

This week we have been lucky enough to meet two different authors! When Kieran Larwood came into class, we found out all about the inspiration behind the Podkin books and the children had a chance to ask lots of questions. The children then designed their own fantasy maps that will inspire some writing of their own. In Maths, we returned to geometry and began recapping some of the tricky vocabulary that geometry brings our way. In geography, we focussed on the physical geography (and geology!) of the Isle of Wight, and talked about what makes our island special, in geographical terms. Our French lesson saw us practising our 'garden' vocabulary in sentences, using the phrases 'il y a' and 'il n'y a pas' to describe what might be and not be in our garden.

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week year 5 participated in some escape room activities! The students had to use their acquired skills and knowledge in both English and Maths to solve problems and answer questions which would give them the digits needed to unlock the escape room door! It was a lot of fun and a great way to consolidate year 5 learning. Additionally in Maths, we have been working on problem solving using decimal numbers. We are still working on finishing our class book, The London Eye Mystery. We can't leave this mystery unsolved! The students are very much looking forward to next week's transition days and sports day! It's hard to believe the end is so near!

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 6 are currently on their Residential visit to Runways End, and they are having an amazing time! Photos will follow next week!

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class we have become more independent in our writing as we wrote about what we did at the weekend and used lots of our tricky words which are familiar to us. We also found a real egg which caused a lot of excitement, however we now think that a fox probably took it from a chicken run and buried it on the school grounds. We did however decide to place our orange dinosaur egg that we found a few weeks ago in some water to see if it cracks...we will keep you posted! The children have also enjoyed some visits to Year 1 and have helped to settle some of our new Reception children ready for September.

The national curriculum for English aims to ensure that pupils develop the habit of reading widely and often for both pleasure and information.

Organised by charity The Reading Agency (www.readingagency.org.uk) and the UK public library network since 1999, the Summer Reading Challenge is the UK's biggest annual reading promotion for children aged 4 to 11.

The Summer Reading Challenge combines FREE access to books with fun, creative activities during the summer holidays. Throughout the Challenge, library staff and young volunteers support the children, helping them to discover new authors and illustrators and to explore a wide range of different types of books and ways of reading.

How the Challenge works

- Children sign up through their local library and receive a Gadgeteers collector poster.
- Children set a reading goal and borrow and read library books of their own choice during the summer, collecting special stickers to complete their poster and extra incentives along the way.
- Library staff and volunteers are on hand to advise and run family-friendly activities.
- Children who complete the Summer Reading Challenge are presented with a certificate and/or a medal.
- The official Challenge website hosts digital rewards, author videos, games and more for children to enjoy all summer: www.summerreadingchallenge.org.uk

How do schools benefit?

- The Summer Reading Challenge is intrinsically inclusive and can contribute to the achievement of ALL your pupils including those with special educational needs, disadvantaged pupils and the most able.
- It enhances and supports your school's reading policy and your mission for all children to read more widely and for pleasure.
- It encourages parental engagement and family involvement in reading and helps your school make links with the library and the wider community.
- It allows children to become more independent in their reading when choosing books and encourages using imagination and empathy to explore a text beyond the page.
- It takes place at your local library and is a brilliant opportunity for extra-curricular activity
- It keeps your pupils reading over the summer, ready for their return to school in the autumn, and supports the successful transition between year groups and key stages.

Transition Taster Days – Tuesday 12th and Wednesday 13th July 2022

The time is fast approaching for your child to get ready for their next step in education, when they join Ryde Academy in September 2022.

We think it is important for students to start thinking about transition early so that they are ready for school in September. As part of this we are inviting all Year 6 students who will be joining us in September 2022 to our school for two days in July.

On Wednesday 13th July at 3:00pm we would like to invite parents and carers with their child to meet the tutors. This will be an opportunity for you to meet face to face with your child's tutor and for you to ask any questions. Should you not be able to attend this session, please get in touch and we will arrange an alternative for you.
