Dear Parents,

What a fantastic week it has been. Thank you all so much for the different ways many of you have contributed and supported the multiple events that have taken place in recent weeks. I am always so delighted to see the school community come together to support one another when needed. An example of this this week has been the amount of parents providing shelters for our sports afternoons so that they could go ahead and also to the volunteers at the Mardi Gras last Saturday. It is times like this I feel very privileged to be the Headteacher of such a great community; so thank you to everyone that has that helped.

Talking of the Mardi Gras, it was such a great event and the children really did us proud! Despite the extreme heat, the children kept smiling and dancing throughout the whole route and received so much feedback from many different people saying that our entry was the best and in particular, the way the children engaged. Thank you so much to all the parents who were marshals and to Charlie's mum in Year 5 for lending us the trolleys to carry our supplies. Thank you also to Miss Clifford for supporting us, but my biggest thank you goes to Miss Wood, who supported carnival club and made costumes in her own time, to Mr Wilford for spending several hours cutting out templates and to Bethany Wilford for teaching dance and leading the dancing on the day.

It feels so long ago that we took our Year 6 children on residential to Runways End in Alder-shot. We had an incredible time and the children were an absolute pleasure to be with. We were commended by the staff for being the best school they have ever had. When I asked them if they said this to all the schools, they told me this was not the case and that our children's behaviour, politeness and engagement was exceptional, and that we should be very proud of their outstanding behaviour. Thank you to Mr Billington, Miss Clifford and Mrs Grimes for joining me and ensuring the children had the best time, and thank you to the parents for allowing us to take their children!

We had two great transition days this week and the children seemed to have had a great time in their new classes. It was lovely to have Mr Scurr in school and also Mrs Fish back with us. Miss Austin enjoyed her new class at Holy Cross school as did Miss Clifford at The Bay Primary. We are very proud of Miss Clifford who had successfully passed her Teaching Assistant Apprenticeship achieving a distinction in her written work - we know she will be a great teacher!

In assembly on Monday we had a visitor from Ryde library who shared information regarding the summer reading challenge. This takes place in all the libraries across the Island and we hope many children will complete this. Six weeks of no school has an impact on learning and if reading is the only thing children keep up, it really does make a difference.

In our VERY long celebration assembly today we congratulated Henry and Owen in Year 1, Harry in Year 2, Max in Year 3 and Phoenix C in Year 4 who took part in the Wessex Cancer Rainbow Run last weekend. Oliver in Year 2 and Cooper in Year 3 attended a cricket camp, Ayla in Year 4 gained a bronze medal in a swimming competition and Charlie in Year 2 took part in his first horse riding competition. Harry in Year 2 gained the supports player trophy and Sebby also in Year 2 gained the players player trophy with their football clubs. Caleb in Year 2 has gained his green strip belt in martial arts and Caleb in Year 3 has gained his yellow belt in Tae Kwon Do. Travis in Year 2 and Tyler in Year 4 have gained a swimming badge and we ended congratulating Lyla in Reception, Emily-Rose, Gracie, Daisy and Ella all in Year 2 who have gained badges in gymnastic and trampoline exams. We presented children with their Bikeability certificate and badges and all the children who took part in the Mardi Gras received a certificate.

We also listened to Mr Billington who shared the latest sports news and achievements in athletics and cross country - well done to all the children involved and thank you to their parents for taking them to the different venues.

We are happy for children to wear their PE kits if they would prefer for these days but please ensure they are the correct school PE uniform. 1.30pm Children dismissed from their classrooms to go home

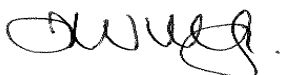

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 1 have had another busy week this week! All of the children really enjoyed their 2 transition days in Year 2, where they did lots of engaging activities including painting, reading and getting to know you activities with Miss Paterson. They also learnt about their new class name author and some of her books. We also had a brilliant sports day where the children participated in a range of events including egg and spoon, obstacle courses and sack races. All of the children also joined in with their running races and did amazingly well!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 2 have had an amazing week this week. The highlight has to be the two transition days where pupils had the chance to experience life in Year 3. Across the two days they completed a range of engaging and exciting activities designed to help decorate their classroom for September and give Mrs Ball a chance to see just how far their learning had come since Year 1. As well as this, pupils this week have started their DT 1600s houses. Working together in small teams they chose and selected the boxes they would use and worked to secure them together. They have now begun the painting process which will be continued next week before we conclude the unit with an exciting firefighting finale. Also this week in Maths, pupils have completed some revision work on the four operations and they have continued work on position and direction writing instructions to get their Beebot from a starting point to symbols on their handmade maps.

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 3 had another fantastic week and really enjoyed their transition days in Year 4! In English this week we finished reading our story 'Wreck of the Zanzibar' then we wrote our favourite part of the story, using paragraphs and varying pronouns to avoid repetition. In Maths we focused on money and practised giving change in practical contexts. We solved problems involving money too. In Science we completed an experiment about how plants transport water. We thought carefully about how to make it a fair experiment and the different ways we could record our results.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP

The Year 4 children have managed so well in the recent heat. They had a wonderful two days experiencing a taster of Year 5 with their September teacher, Mr Scurr. The children worked hard on a theme park project, which involved creative design elements as well as applying Maths to a real world context in order to calculate their budget and ticket prices. Mr Scurr complimented their resilience and independence. Back in Year 4, the children have been continuing their Geography project on Newtown, by comparing both the physical and human Geography of Newtown with that of London. In French, we challenged ourselves to translate some sentences using what we already know and some new vocabulary. During Maths lessons, we have refined our understanding of symmetry with some reasoning tasks and in English we have enjoyed using the laptops to write a narrative.

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

It has been a super busy week with transition days and sports days! Year 5 enjoyed their days with Mrs Digweed and seemed very excited for all of the adventures yet to come in the next year. They also got to sit on the benches in assembly, such a big coming-of-age moment for them! As always, sports day was a big hit with lots of fun had by all. I am always so impressed and proud of the children's teamwork, cooperation, and school spirit! One more week of Year 5 to go!!!

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 6 have had a very busy week!

On Tuesday and Wednesday, all of our year 6s visited their new high schools. We heard lots about it on their return, and it sounds as though they all had a great time.

On Thursday the class helped to run the Key stage 1 sports day. The whole class did a fantastic job, and were complimented by many of the KS1 parents and families on how well they conducted themselves when working with the younger children.

On Friday the class had their last Primary School sports day! It was very warm but fun was had all round and they all did amazingly!

Sports News

Year 1/2 Cross Country:

On Monday we entered our first Key Stage 1 sports competition of the year. These are rare events and it was great that we could get a team across to Lanesend Primary School. Similar to the Year 5/6 event a boys, girls and mixed team attempted 4 laps of a 400m circuit. Despite some very nervous and excited children they all performed fantastically. The weather was even hotter than the Yr 5/6 event and just completing the lap was an achievement.

Our boys team did really well. Isaac S, Levi B, Sebby R and Harry D ran a brilliant race and it was between us and Lanesend. Sebby ran a great third leg to bring us back in contention and Harry did his best to catch the final runner. Finishing 2nd by a few metres was an impressive comeback, well done boys!

Our girls raced next. Emily-rose S, Daisy L, Hayley W and Ella S took on the challenge. Emily-rose and Daisy got us off to a good start and kept us in contention, we were third after two legs. Then Hayley took on the challenge of catching 2nd and possibly 1st. What followed was one of the most impressive runs of the afternoon! Hayley was incredible, she not only caught 2nd but passed 1st and created a good lead for Ella. Hayley's pacing was very impressive, she is a star of the future! Ella gave the gutsiest run of the day. Knowing that she had to try and stay in the lead, she gave it her all. Ella managed it and Wootton are U7 Girls Champions! Well done girls, a great achievement!

Our mixed team of Travis W, Charlie H, Emire H and Frankie T took on the challenge next. The team did incredibly well and were up against some tough opposition, of mostly Year 2 runners. Despite this they were always in contention for a good position. Everyone ran a great leg and Wootton finished in 2nd place. This has been one of our most successful events this year and it's all down to the children who really showed determination and incredible effort to succeed. An amazing afternoon, well done to the athletes and parents for your transport and support.

Year 3/4 Quadkids Athletics:

Another hot day on Wednesday meant our Year 3 and 4 teams attending the Quadkids Athletics at Greenmount would face a very tough challenge. The event is designed to test all skills related to athletics: running, jumping and throwing. Every child in each team competed in every activity, 400m, 50m sprint, standing long jump and hurler throw. Their times and distances equated to points which then counted to their individual and team scores.

We were fortunate to be able to enter two teams. Our A team consisted of Ayra Q, Lexi G, Molly S, Penny T, Elliott W, Rocco S and Tyler W from Year 4 and Jacob S from Year 3. The B team consisted of Blaise GH, Koby H, Evie-May N, Ayla B, Imogen L and Sadie M from Year 4 and Evan S and Braeden R from Year 3.

Both teams did incredibly well in all their events. Our B Team finished 10th overall. A particular mention to Evie-May in Year 4 who stepped up at the last minute to fill in and then proceeded to finish 14th out of the girls and 50th overall. Well done Evie-May!

Our A Team finished 6th overall, but this doesn't tell the whole story. Only 27 points off 3rd and 66 points from 1st. A few extra cm's and a couple of seconds here and there and you never know.

However, I have two special mentions from Team A. Jacob S in Year 3 is a fantastic athlete and his 50m sprint time of 8.4 seconds placed him in the top 5 of all the participants. Well done Jacob. Our star performer of the day was Tyler W. He was incredibly consistent over all the events but his throw placed him 4th out of all competitors. It meant he finished 6th overall! It's an amazing achievement and you should be very proud.

Thank you to the parents for your support and transport and well done to all the athletes who competed.

Sports Days are well under way and already we can see some star performances.

Thank you for everyone's support over the year, Wootton has had an incredible year and I hope it continues.
