Dear Parents,

Yet again our Wootton school community have pulled together and shown such support and commitment to fundraising activities in school. We were totally amazed at how many donations we received on Tuesday - the goods filled my car boot and back seat! The children all contributed to a wonderful Harvest service with every class performing a song or poem, many thanks to the parents and grandparent helpers who supported the walk. I delivered all the donations to Oakfield Primary School who run a pantry for the community. This is a resource that can be accessed by anyone struggling financially, I will share details next week of how you can access this.

Today we have been a 'sea' of yellow! We have raised **£321.50** for Earl Mountbatten Hospice as a result of all your incredible donations. So many children completed a colouring that I had to go out and get more prizes during the day and thank goodness I didn't have the job of choosing the winners! Mrs Pye had to make the difficult decisions along with deciding the best model. The children have clearly worked so hard on this and we wish we could make them all winners, but Mrs Pye managed to select winners looking in particular at children's own work. So the colouring/picture winners are Phoenix B in Reception, Nicholas in Year 1, Ivy in Year 2, Emilyrose in Year 3, Faye in Year 4, Chloe in Year 5, Ben in Year 6 and the model winner is Summer (with the help from Poppy) in Year 6. The number of sweets in the jar was 77 correctly guessed by Harry in Year 1 - well done and thank you to EVERYONE involved today!

It was lovely to meet with several parents at the AGM on Tuesday and I am pleased that several parents have put themselves forward to fill the committee roles. The first PTA event is the school disco on Friday 21st October. The cost is £3 per child that includes entry, a drink, biscuit and bag of sweets. Payment will be taken on the day and there will be additional sweets and glow sticks available to purchase if you want to send extra money with your child. The first disco is from 3pm to 4.15pm for Reception, Years 1 and 2. Year 3 can decide whether they want to attend this one or the later one for Key Stage 2 which is from 4.30pm to 6pm. Children can dress in Halloween outfits if they want, so younger children will need to bring these in and will have time to change in class before the disco begins. Younger children will need to ensure their money is in a named envelop please and given to the class teacher on the day. Parents are not expected to attend either disco but please note children in Key Stage 2 WILL NOT be allowed to walk home, all children will need to be collected from the hall. After half-term we will hold another PTA meeting to plan a potential Christmas fayre. Please note that the reason I say potential is that unless we have sufficient numbers of parent helpers, we will not be able to run this event. I will send more details after half-term.

In assembly today we congratulated Sadie in Year 5 who had great success at a dance festival on the mainland last weekend where she competed against many other dancers. We also heard from Ayla who has been collecting 'nurdles' (small pieces of

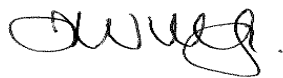

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class we have continued to explore making patterns independently using 'potatoes' to link in with our theme of Supertato. We have continued to do work related to the sounds 's' and 'p' and carried out a sorting activity whereby we had to sort a range of objects into 2 hoops. One hoop had 's' written in it and the other had 'p'. We also enjoyed our first marble party having successfully filled our marble jar.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In English this week we started by writing a list of equipment Beegu needs to bring to earth with him. Then we practised writing sentences for Beegu, using capital letters and full stops. In Maths we partitioned 5 into two parts in different ways using a variety of objects to help us. We recorded our answers pictorially. In RE, we discussed religious symbols and looked at some symbols of Christianity such as a cross and a candle. In Geography this week we looked at maps of our school and the local area and thought about the different symbols on the maps. Then we created our own map of the playground, using symbols and a key.

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Wow, another amazing week of work in Year 2! Mrs Wilford visited us on Wednesday and both she and Miss Paterson were blown away by our independent and enthusiastic writing all about the brave rescue Grace Darling performed nearly 200 years ago. We can't believe how much they have learned since the start of Year 2! The class have enjoyed looking through their historical telescopes to compare life now with the life of Grace Darling, and have also started to create textured sea scape paintings based on the ferocious storm on the night of the rescue. In Maths we have continued our focus on ordering numbers, paying close attention to tens and ones, and we rounded off the week with our "go bananas" treat for earning so many points for politeness, good behaviour, kindness and effort. A huge well done to everyone!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week Year 3 have continued looking at poetry. They independently planned, wrote and then performed their poems to the class. In Maths, we moved onto money. We have been adding and subtracting amounts of money and started looking at the concept of change. In Science we completed an experiment on how we can make shadows change size by changing the proximity of the torch to the object. The children all really enjoyed recorders this week. It was wonderful to hear so many of them perform.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

It has been a busy but delightful week in Year 4. Well done to the whole class for their performance on Tuesday at the Harvest Festival. The children were super excited to get the chance to share their song with other year groups. We began our English lessons this week finishing up and polishing the monster stories we had planned and begun writing at the end of last week. We then looked at a story in a similar style to that of Beowulf and completed some inference around the opening to the book. In Maths, we have been looking at measure. We have calculated the perimeter of shapes and recorded our answers in different ways. We have begun to look at measure conversion, using our understanding of multiplication and division, and have begun to apply this to problems. During the afternoons, we have looked at which chocolate is the best carried in a warm pocket. We have made alterations to our art design based on our practice printing lesson last week and we have focussed on feelings in PSHE.

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In Year 5 this week, we have continued to read more of Kensuke's Kingdom and used this text as a base to write a persuasive letter in English. In Maths we have explored area and perimeter of rectilinear and compound shapes and are starting to learn about common multiples and factor pairs. In Science we conducted an experiment where we explored how to separate solids from a mixture. The highlight of the week was our class performing their harvest song 'A very special vegetable' amazingly well. I am so proud!



WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In English we have been continuing our journey with War Horse and have been looking in particular at writing informally including question tags. In Maths we have been looking at word problems using addition and subtraction, including using visual methods in order to interpret a question. In Geography we have continued to look at the importance of the river Thames, in relation to London and looked at its many uses both historically and today.

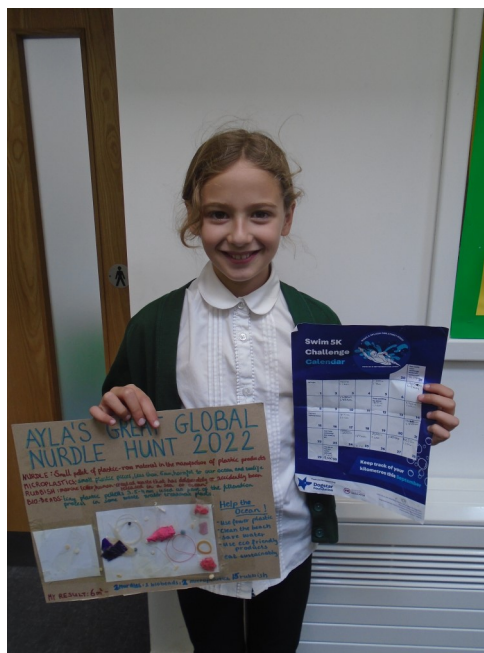

We listen to your concerns and work with you to identify a planned way forward by providing you with impartial information and advice to enable you to make informed decisions about your child.

Many children and young people will access advice, information and support via their parents but some children, especially older children, may want to access it separately. Under these circumstances we will work individually and impartially with the young person.
