We have had our delivery of shoe boxes, please pop into the office if you would like a box to make up. These will be collected on Friday 20th October so please ensure you have sent them in before then.

You may recall in the newsletter last week I shared the news that Mrs Pye, our School Business Manager (SBM) will be off for a while. I am so very grateful to another local school who have been able to release their SBM for us to have support a day a week. We welcome Mrs Angela Dexter to the team!

One of the many elements of my job, and one of the parts I enjoy the most, is spending time in classrooms working alongside staff and children. This enables me to have a really good insight as to what and how the children are learning and informs our school improvement plan. One of the things I noticed this week is the number of toys and fidget toys children are bringing in. Toys should not be sent into school unless been asked for by your child's teacher. Often these go missing or get accidentally damaged so we ask that toys are kept at home. We recognise though that some children need support with focus and concentration and at times a fidget toy can help. These must be agreed with your child's teacher who will have guidance from Mrs Grimes our SENCo. If it is felt that your child would benefit from a small item SCHOOL will provide this. We have seen an increasing number of items coming in and in particular the 'chew' style toys which with the weather changing and germs spreading, we want to keep to a minimum for the children that really need these items. Thank you for your support.

Please keep checking your uniform is named as our lost property is already growing and fills two large boxes! Our Year 6 office helpers ensure that all named items are returned to the owners but with so many unnamed belongings they are limited in doing so! Please also ensure that trainers are only worn with PE kits and PE shorts and trousers MUST be plain black. Only ONE pair of stud earrings are permitted to be worn to school and the only other item of jewellery is a watch. Long hair must be worn up at all times. Thank you for your continued support.

I am delighted to see many children using our reading shed now that it is in full operation! As the weather starts to change we would like to be able to have some outdoor blankets and cushions for the children. If you are able to donate any of these please send them into school, thank you.

Every week we are going to be celebrating some of the fantastic achievements and efforts of the children during sport and PE. WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class we have been so busy focusing on our phonics and the children have worked so hard to learn the new sounds and listen carefully to the sounds to blend them to make words. In maths we have been counting with 1:1 correspondence and have been counting peas related to the Evil Pea in our Supertato story! In the Expressive Arts area we have used paper plates and have made our own evil peas. In the outside area we have been busy sorting our garden area and removing weeds whilst exploring the tyres. The children have been rolling these up the bank and have then let them roll back down. This is really good for developing their core strength!

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 1 have been working their socks off again this week! We have started a new story in English called Beegu and have explored how the character's feelings are shown through her ears. We all enjoyed making our own pair of Beegu ears for role-play :)

We also started to use sentences to describe Beegu, remembering to end our finished sentence with a full stop.

In Maths we have been thinking about partitioning numbers to 5 and writing number sentences alongside these.

We had a very stinky science lesson, thinking all about our sense of smell. We explored different hidden smells to see if we could work out what they were just by using our noses. We have also started our sewing project in DT, and identified natural features of our school environment in Geography. The children are also very excited to have earned enough class points for a banana party next week - well done, everyone!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Another great week in Year 2!

In English, we have been looking at using exclamation marks. We looked at our Traction Man book and spotted lots of places they have been used. As a class we discussed why they had been used and the impact it has on the reader. The Children wrote some sentences of their own, adding exclamation marks to let the reader know something very exciting was happening. We then went on to plan our own adventure for Traction Man. The children will be applying their new knowledge of exclamation marks to this writing next week.

We also looked at Traction Man in science this week. Traction Man required a new tent for his latest mission. The children had to design a tent and decide what material they thought would be best for this product. We went outside and tested out many different materials to see if they were waterproof, flexible, light and durable in any weather. The children really enjoyed this task and asked if next week we could make a tent and leave it outside in different weather conditions to see what happens!

In Art, we looked at the stormy conditions Grace Darling and her Father battled when rescuing the famous shipwreck. We looked at the colours and varying tones of the sky during storms and then used our learning from previous lessons to mix paints and use varying tones to produce a sky-scape of a storm.

All the children have worked really hard again this week! Big well done Year 2!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

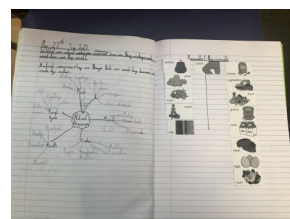
Year 3 have continued to learn more about instruction writing in English and have been busy using the key features that are needed when writing their own set of instructions for how to make their own dream jars. In Maths the children have continued to learn about how mental maths can help them solve addition and subtraction problems and that knowing their number bonds can help them when crossing the 10s and 100s boundary; they have also been using number lines to support them this week. In Geography, we learnt more about London and made predictions about its land use in the future and drew maps of it too. In Science we learnt more about light and how shadows are created. In French the children continued to greet people at different times of the day and recorded these greetings in their French books. Keep up all of your good work, it always gets noticed.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP

Another busy yet brilliant week in Year 4! In English, using inspiration from Beowulf, we have been creating our own monster suspense stories which have left Miss Cooke feeling spooked! In Maths we have been working with money and exploring methods to help us when adding and subtracting amounts, particularly where so many items end with 99p. In science, we became experimenters to find out which type of chocolate would melt first (dark, milk, or white). Meanwhile, in PSHE, we identified different intensities of good and not-so good feelings e.g sad, depressed, devastated and discussed ways of coping when we may not be feeling so good. In addition, we compared how Anglo-Saxon and Roman beliefs differed and worked as groups to create a Venn diagram to share with the class. Well done Richards class!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Another busy and brilliant week in Year 5. In English, the children have used their knowledge of personification and similes to write wonderful ocean themed poems. They were also challenged to include hyperbole and prepositions in their poems, all of which have turned into wonderful reads. In the latter part of the week, the children used their new found poetic skills to write different types of poem. On Thursday, they wrote acrostic poems and Friday, rhythmic poems. In maths, we have explored perimeter and area. The children worked hard to improve their understanding of compound shapes and were able to problem solve to find missing lengths and areas. We have also moved on to multiples – finding the first ten multiples of a given number and learning how to identify the lowest common multiple of two given numbers. In the wider curriculum we have explored the concept of belonging in Islam, learned the names and uses of several natural resources and investigated how some everyday materials can be categorised.



WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week the Year 6 class has been using persuasive language techniques to write a pamphlet in which the Army is appealing to farmers to sell their horses for the war effort. We have been learning how to write language which is assertive rather than pleading or threatening. In maths we have used mental maths methods to calculate additions and subtractions. We have thought very carefully about which method is the most efficient for different calculations. In art, we used chalks in the playground and on the exterior of the school buildings to convey messages in the style of Banksy. Some messages were about the environment and others were about how we should treat others. They made a colourful and thought-provoking spectacle!

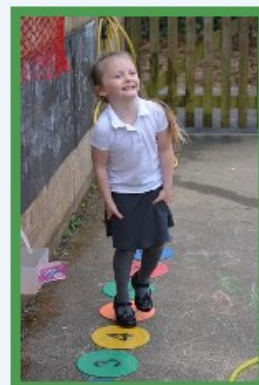

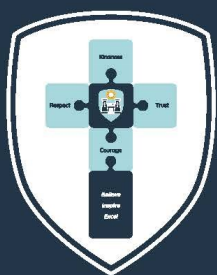
