Dear Parents,

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

In Reception class this week we have been looking at the initial letters in words and have tried to identify the sound/phoneme whilst also identifying the first sound in objects such as a tomato, a sock, a snake, an insect. This is related to the sounds we have covered so far.

In maths we have been subitizing. This is where you look at an amount of objects and say how many there are without counting them. The children worked really hard on this and could generally subitize up to 4 before needing to count them.

We have also made collages of Supertato which we are going to use as a display outside our classroom door. We opened the sandpit this week and the children really enjoyed playing in it.

We talked about needing to wear our boots and that only 4 children could fit in there at a time.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 1 have been beavering away this week in their play-based learning creating treasure maps, dressing body shapes with fabric clothes and building exciting marble run lay outs!

In English we have started thinking about using capital letters and full stops whilst writing letters to Beegu's mum and dad. In Maths we have been exploring teen numbers and how these are written using our knowledge of tens and ones. In Geography we watched our exciting drone video again and had a go at drawing a simple bird's eye view map of our school - featuring all our favourite things! In DT we have continued our sewing project, and we enjoyed listening to two new songs during Music. Our Science lesson saw us tasting sweet, sour and salty foods and differentiating between them. Well done, everyone!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

What a fantastic week!

The children in year 2 have worked so hard on their writing this week. The progress we have seen in just a few short weeks has blown us away. The children wrote the next story of Traction Man and his new Evil Villain, Shark Scissors. The children applied all their learning of adjectives and capitalising proper nouns. We are incredibly proud of them all.

In Maths, we have had a much more practical week. We started by looking at measuring in cm and using < > and = to compare lengths. We then moved onto recapping coins. The children will be using coins next week when adding and taking away.

In RE we have been looking at special places. Last week we focused on a special place within the Hindu religion, the Mandir. We learnt about some of the Hindu beliefs and looked at images from inside a Mandir temple. This week we thought about the importance of special places within many different religions and how people would feel if these special places were no longer there.

Keep up the hard work Year 2!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Yet again Year 3 have been really busy planning their own instruction writing and using all the key features that they know are needed when writing their own set of recipe instructions for a potion; they have certainly been very imaginative. In Maths the children have continued to learn more about addition and subtraction and how to use place value grids, place value coins and dienes to support them when setting out their own written calculations. In Geography, we learnt more about London and made suggestions about why people would want to live in London. In Science we learnt how to make a shadow larger or smaller. In French the children learnt how to ask someone how they were feeling and how to respond when asked the same question. Well done Year 3, we are all very proud of the progress you are making and the continued effort you always show.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP

This week, Year 4 has been learning lots of exciting things! In English, we began our new book, the legendary 'Sword in the Stone'. In preparation for creating our newspaper reports, we have been learning about newspaper features including headlines, captions and formal language; Year 4 has already come up with some fantastic headlines using their alliterative skills! In maths, we have been busy measuring and converting units of length, and we even went to the playground to measure various objects to showcase these skills. In History, we delved into the intriguing question of whether Alfred the Great truly deserved his title. On the emotional front, as part of our PSHE topic, we have been exploring the physical effects of feelings and ways we can equip ourselves with tools to help us recognise and support ourselves and our peers who may be facing challenges. Overall, it has been a very busy week and I look forward to another great week ahead.

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

What a wonderful week in Year 5. This week we have explored persuasion in English and learned how to use various techniques to plan a persuasive letter, which we will write next week. We also tested our knowledge of persuasion in guided reading by answering various comprehension questions about a persuasive letter based on Kensuke's Kingdom. In maths we have learned how to multiply and divide a given number by 10, 100 and 1000 as well as how to identify prime and composite numbers. In geography we continued our study of natural resources by focusing on the wealth specific countries can accumulate from their resources. In Computing, we learned how a system works and had a go at designing our own toy.

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in English lessons we have started exploring the difference between formal and informal writing, by learning about question tags and writing an informal letter from the trenches of WWI. The children did a great job taking on a casual, relaxed tone in their writing. In maths we have begun our unit on multiplication and division by working with factors and multiples. We are all realising how important it is to know our times tables as fluently as possible! The children enjoyed making periscopes in science as part of our learning about the way light travels. In PSHE we have worked on how to be assertive and in geography we started comparing different cities in the UK to find out what makes London so different and especially suited to being the capital city

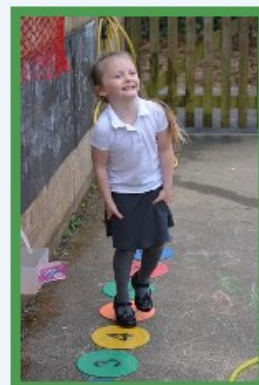

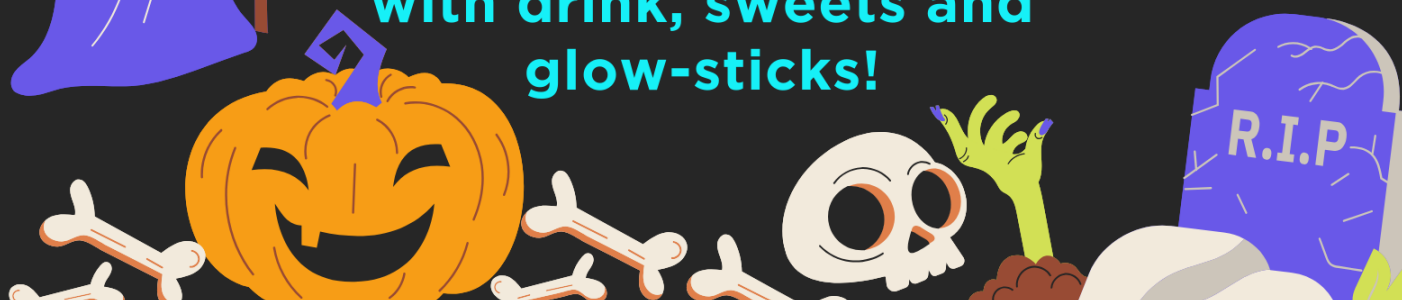
