Another busy week in school with lots of fantastic learning taking place: **Year 4** had a brilliant experience on their Evacuee day at Havenstreet, sporting 1940s outfits and really getting into the spirit of the era through different role play activities; **Reception class** has really impressed Mrs Cowell with their work on odd and even numbers; and

Year 5 got out in the boats for the first time at their Sailing session this week!

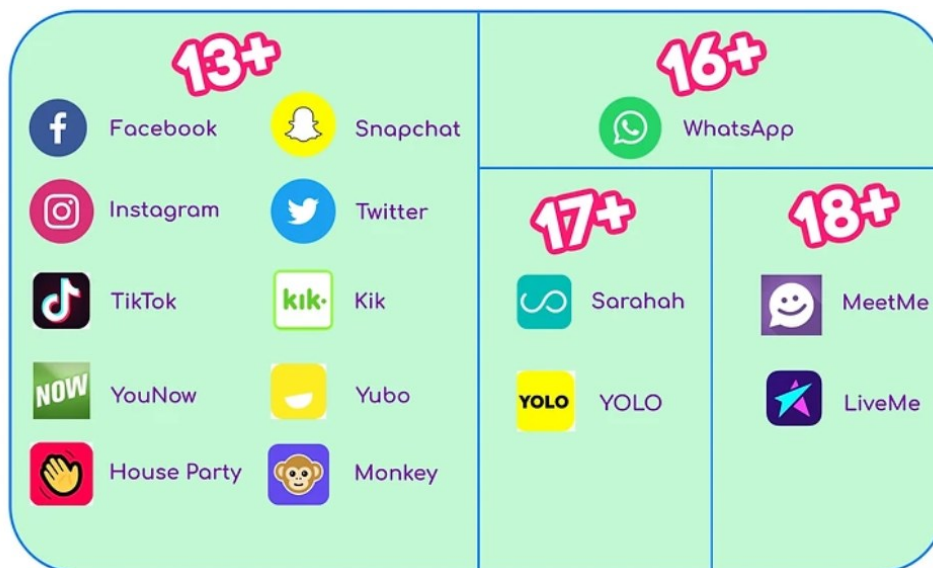
We also had many children who were presented with a range of **reading achievement certificates**, including two more gold awards—keep up the great work everyone!

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class we have continued to pick up the work we started last week with the children on a 1:1 basis. We have embedded the concept of odd and even numbers even more and during carpet times we have explored the numbers and have looked at our explanations as to whether a number is odd or even. The children writing their pirate lists have had to think hard about what they want to take with them on an adventure and have used the sound mats if they wanted to. On the writing table we have been creating our own pirates (using photocopied clothes) and the children have designed their own and have attempted to describe and label the clothing. We have also been busy making bird nests and drawing birds to sit on our nests. This came about by watching the blue tits nesting in our bird boxes!

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 1 have been researching this week, finding out all about Meerkats. They have learned lots of new facts and presented them in headed sections within their own fact file. In Maths the class have been exploring numbers beyond 50, representing these using practical resources and Numicon, and finding one more and one less up to 100. Great work, everyone!

Our wider curriculum subjects have matched up perfectly this week, considering what it is like in the Sahara desert during Geography, exploring different animal groups which may live in the desert during Science, and experimenting with using different shades of "hot" colours to create a desert scene with water colour paints in art. We rounded off the week with a great PE session outside, and continued our work in RE around generosity, considering people in our community who help to support others.

Keep up the amazing reading at home too - there are a few more gold awards for 200 reads coming up!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In English this week, we have been coming up with alternative endings to fairy tales. The class really enjoyed this challenge and came up with some pretty gruesome and also very funny endings to The Three Little Pigs. The quality and presentation of writing has been superb this week. Well done everyone for putting in your best effort!

In Maths, we have been looking at multiplication and division. The children are now really secure with recalling the facts for the 10 times tables and were really effective in using them to solve a range of problems. During History, the class thought about how we know so much about The Great Fire of London. We discussed how we find out information now and how many of our sources of information weren't available all those years ago. So how do we know about this great event? Can we fully trust the historical sources of information we have from back then? This was a very thought provoking lesson, with lots of varying opinions. We also had a super Art lesson this week. On Tuesday, we used pastels to create images in a similar way to Monet. We then looked at how we can effectively blend pastels together to create a varied tone and change the mood of our art work.

Another great week, made even better by the rare appearance of the sun!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 3 have been focusing on Money in Maths and have been showing their understanding of coins and notes when counting, adding and subtracting money. They have used their own working out and drawings of money to help them solve word-problems that involve adding and subtracting money and know how important it is to check their change when purchasing items.

In English, we have continued to read more of our class text, 'I was there - Boudica's Army' by Hilary McKay. This week, the children have worked on using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions in their sentences and diaries when writing from Kassy and another character's point of view. Old Flax has certainly made us giggle this week and has made an appearance in almost all of their diary writes.

In French, we have been listening to and repeating important commands such as listen and look and the children have enjoyed asking others to do what they have asked of them.

In Geography, we have been learning more about Newchurch and have used Google Maps to locate and find out more about the village. The class have also added photographs from Newchurch to their Google Slides and started to email their Google slides through to the year 3 email address in their ICT lessons.

Well done for yet another busy and focused week of learning year 3, keep up the good work as always.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

So many wonderful things have happened this week in Year 4, it's hard to know where to begin! In Maths, we have begun our Geometry unit. We started the week calculating the area of rectilinear shapes, and moved onto comparing and ordering angles by the end of the week. In English, we have been very productive with our writing! We have managed to complete a narrative and a recount of our trip. In addition, we have explored diary entry examples in preparation of creating our own next week. This will be written from the perspective of David in our story who is writing to his mother to let her know what his new life is like in the countryside. We had another fun-filled Wednesday with the brass instruments, and in DT, we researched the Dig for Victory campaign and created our own colourful posters that could have been used to encourage people to grow their own vegetables.

Lastly (but by no means least!), we had the most amazing time at The Steam Railway. Year 4 looked spectacular in their costumes and we couldn't have asked for better weather!



WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Another busy week in Year 5. In English this week, we have learned how to write formal letters and have applied our knowledge of the class novel, Holes, to write a formal letter of complaint to the camp warden. In Maths, we recapped time - both 12 and 24 hour- and used that knowledge to solve sum, comparison and difference questions based on timetables. We also recapped line graphs and tables. In computing, we continued our study of physical computing by coding a microcontroller. In science, we learned the features and typical life cycle of a reptile and in PE the children enjoyed another wonderful sailing experience at Seaview yacht club. However, my highlight of the week was geography. On Thursday afternoon, we welcomed Ian Menzies who shared his experience of being a business owner in the food and drink industry. The children relished the opportunity to learn how a local island business generates money and contributes to the Island economy. Well done for the hard work this week Year 5, keep it up!
