WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

Our Reception children had a great day in Year 1 on Tuesday and they enjoyed spending time with their new teachers and playing with all the new resources. They had so much fun that some children asked if they could go back the next day, which is very positive! The children have enjoyed making dinosaur eggs this week. This has involved cutting out an egg shape and attaching the two halves with a split pin. They then drew a dinosaur head and body and stuck it behind the egg. This was a really good activity to develop the children's fine motor skills. We have been doing some simple number sentences this week involving addition and also a bit of doubling. The children have been very busy creating different animal worlds but mainly for the dinosaurs and we have had lots of dens built inside the classroom.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 1 had a wonderful day visiting Year 2 on Tuesday and enjoyed getting to know Mrs Ball. They showed themselves to be mature and ready to take on the next challenge and should be very proud of themselves. Back in class, we have been looking at some poems about sea creatures and worked hard to collect lots of different adjectives to describe these. Then we wrote Who am I? poems, giving clues as to which creature we were pretending to be, making sure we used lots of descriptive language. The class really enjoyed testing each other to guess their animals!

In Maths we have returned to addition, using a number line to add efficiently in ones and tens. Our understanding of numbers to 100 is improving every day and we have been impressed with how well the children are now able to apply their learning more independently. Well done, everyone.

During History this week, we wrote postcards in role to draw together all our learning about the seaside now and in the past. In PSHE we have been thinking about how to keep ourselves healthy, and in computing we are still working on word processing. Another super week; keep up the hard work for the last two :)

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Another brilliant week, Year 2! The class all really enjoyed their transition day up to Year 3 and are all very excited about September.

In English, we started the week by writing our own ending to Fantastic Mr Fox. We had some great predictions and ideas on how the book is going to end and we're all eager to finish the book next week! We then moved onto planning and writing a sequel of Fantastic Mr Fox. We looked carefully at the make up of a variety of stories and films and found some common themes. We then used this format to plan our own sequel. The children showed a really strong understanding of the book we've read so far, and applied this really well to their planning and writing.

In maths, we looked at position, turn and direction. The class carried out some practical activities having to follow instructions and instruct others using the correct language. They all really enjoyed this and we did eventually get outside on a dry day and play some direction games. We then also started looking at 2D shapes and their properties. After a quick recap, the class recalled this information really well and carried out a variety of tasks.

To draw together our geography topic, comparing the Isle of Wight and Kota Kinabalu, the children created their own TV adverts promoting the Island. We watched a few examples and then thought of the best places to visit. The children did an absolutely fantastic job of these!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Last Friday the class produced, tasted, and evaluated their freshly made bread rolls before taking one home at the end of the day.

After finishing reading 'The Wreck of The Zanzibar' last week, the children have been busy planning and writing instructions about how they would save a turtle if they found one washed up from the sea, just like Laura Perryman had to.

In science, we have continued to find out more about magnets and their strength, and experimented with testing this when attracting different amounts of paper clips that were attached to the string.

In French, the children have been learning about transport and have started asking their partners questions about how they travelled to school.

This week has been yet another busy week and the class moved up to year 4 on Tuesday and got to meet Miss Cooke and the rest of the year 4 team. On Wednesday afternoon, they also watched the current year 4 perform fabulously on their trumpets or trombones, and are looking forward to playing these instruments next year.

Keep working hard; we still have lots to learn before the end of term.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Lots of exciting things have been happening in Year 4 this week. The class enjoyed their transition day up to Year 5 with Mrs Fish and Mrs Gilbert. Despite not having Mrs Adams, the children were excited to tell me all about their new class name, and the fun activities they took part in. In music, the class completed their brass lessons with Mr Stroud and put on a performance to the current Year 3 class to showcase their skills. In English, we have been writing our formal letter from the point of view of Podkin One-Ear, requesting help from the terrifying Gorm! In maths, we have been calculating the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and learning how to calculate missing lengths. To finish the week on a high, Year 4 were very fortunate to have a visit from local author, Kieran Larwood. The class took part in a fun workshop and had a Q&A session to find out more about Larwood and his work.

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

As the end of year draws nearer, the work has not yet stopped in Year 5. This week, the children have applied their knowledge of our class text 'The Egyptian Cinderella' and have begun writing a newspaper report based on the Greek slave Rhodopis becoming queen of all Egypt. In maths, we have begun covering some of the misconceptions highlighted in the end of year assessments - rounding decimals. This week the children also took part in an upper Key Stage 2 sex and relationship education morning, where we covered all of the topics listed in the letter you received a couple of weeks ago. Both Ms White and I were very impressed with the level of maturity with which the children approached this subject. We also concluded our sailing sessions this week with a wonderful final lesson exploring more of the coastline around Seaview. My highlight of the week, however, was transition day. All of the staff involved commented on how well the majority of the class conducted themselves! Well done Year 5, you continue to make me and the school proud.

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year Six has had an exciting and varied week! We began the week with some Leavers activities and more work in PE preparing for Sports Day next week. Then on Tuesday the children headed off to Big School! We hope they had an exciting day in their new secondary schools and are full of enthusiasm for the coming year. They are growing up so quickly and displaying such confidence and maturity. Later in the week, they worked on their entrepreneur project ready for Friday's summer fair, which we hope you can attend so that you can support their business ventures. The children had informative sessions about how the body changes as we grow and the function of human reproduction so you may (or may not) enjoy some follow-up questions at home. They dealt with all the information maturely and with curiosity. During computing, the Year Sixes exercised their editing skills in CapCut to work on their film project. We hope that you enjoy reading the children's reports and that you are as delighted as we are with their SATs results. Every single child blew us away with their progress and achievements and we are immeasurably proud of them all.
