Thank you so much for all your support at our fantastic **PTA event last Friday evening**. Many thanks to Layla and Chris along with the staff and parent helpers who gave their time to ensure that the event took place. It was lovely to see children dressed up and many congratulations again to the Smith family for their superb circus outfits. We are delighted to share that the event raised **£1,204.46 profit** which will be put together with the sponsored walk money to enhance our playtime provision and outdoor seating. Thank you to our two sponsors T & D decorators and Cherry Godfrey and to you all for spending lots of money!

Well done to Year 2 for their excellent behaviour on their educational visit to the Owl and Monkey Haven yesterday. The children were very brave when given the opportunity to experience some animals they may not have encountered before! Thank you to the staff and parents who went with the class.

Our Year 6 children continue to amaze us, this time with their fantastic planning and running of the Key Stage 1 sports afternoon on Tuesday. They were such good role models and ensured that all the children got the chance to be involved. In assembly today we presented the **Sports Cup** to Farrell House (yellow) who have the most sports points over the year with 1975 points. 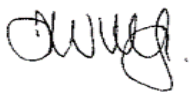
We also congratulated several children for their reading awards. Today we had one bronze, two silver awards and two gold awards. Keep up the great work everyone!

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class the children have been lucky enough to spend some time with Mrs Deakin ahead of them going into Year 1. The children have been busy doing some simple number sentences using concrete resources and some have attempted to write a number sentence as well. We have had a big push on our phonics and have been 'chunking' longer words to make it a bit easier for them to read. Luca-Ray's grandad made each of the children a little dinosaur egg so the children have had lots of fun colouring them in ahead of bringing them home this week. Outside the children have been making bug homes and have collected a range of creatures although we have had a couple of snails escape in class! The children really enjoyed sports day and it was fantastic to see them confidently talking to unfamiliar adults and children and having a go at all the activities. Well done everyone.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Year 1 had a fantastic time on sports day and I was so pleased to see them all supporting each other and showing great sportsmanship! Well done everyone for working your hardest and, most importantly, having fun :)

Back in the classroom we have been enjoying some different poems about the seaside, diving underwater to imagine what it would be like to explore the ocean, and writing about our experiences of sandy beach picnics during English. The class's phonics continues to go from strength to strength and they are now tackling some more unusual spellings of sounds with great success. In Maths we have continued to think about subtraction, using number lines to show our working and developing more efficient methods including using our number bonds to calculate. We have also been focusing on PSHE this week, exploring how to stay healthy, what babies, toddlers and children can do at different ages, and how many jobs grown ups need to do to take care of babies when they are first born. The whole class found it really interesting to learn about how important it is for babies to hear songs and rhymes and laughter to help develop their brain connections!

To round off the week we really got stuck in to our Art day, exploring the work of the sculptor Paul Morrison and then making our own interpretations of his work. Amazing job, everyone!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

What a fabulous and very busy week in Year 2!

This week we have had the pleasure of Sports Day, our educational visit to Owl and Monkey Haven, and Art day.

A big well done to all the children for their participation on sports day. It was wonderful to see them all outside joining in a variety of different activities and all having lots of fun.

Our class visit to Owl and Monkey Haven was a huge success! The weather was beautiful and the class all had a brilliant day. We were able to apply lots of our learning from our current science topic and asked some fantastic questions to the keepers. The class behaved brilliantly and were great ambassadors for the school.

On Friday we had an Art day and looked at the artist Naomi Veitch. Naomi makes wire sculptures of local fish in Australia, where she lives. We looked at some of Naomi's sculptures and then researched fish local to the Isle of Wight. We then designed and created our own sculptures using pipe cleaners. We used foil to create a metallic texture. The children thought the sculptures would look even better with a coloured background, so we used different tones of blue to create a sea backdrop.

A really fun and exciting week hopefully the sun will stay put for the weekend!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

What another busy week we have had,! We have continued to look at instruction writing and have identified the key features that are needed when writing a set of instructions. The children have used these features to help them plan a set of instructions about how to keep an animal of their choice clean. In maths we have continued to look at place value and worked to solve problems related to place value. Sports Day on Wednesday was also a real positive this week where the children were able to share their achievements and successes in their house teams. The children also managed to craft some fantastic floral creations today when learning about Judith Brown and her wire sculptures during our Art Day.

Well done Year 3, another week of making us proud of all of your achievements

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Year 4, we have been writing a biography for author Kieran Larwood, focusing on themed paragraphs and fronted adverbials. In Maths, we have been recapping some of our knowledge from the year, including factor pairs, multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100, and rounding. In RE, we have been learning about the concept of God and identifying some of God's behaviour in stories such as The Exodus and David and Goliath. We then compared these interpretations of God to our own, and discussed the similarities and differences. Sports day was a great success for Year 4, and all the children collaborated well with their house colours and displayed effective teamwork. Finally, we enjoyed Art day at the end of the week where we got creative and explored the work of artist Albert Giacometti. Giacometti's work inspired us to create our own Stone Age sculptures using pipe cleaners and papier mâché. Well done Year 4, I can't believe next week is our last!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

What a busy last full week of Year 5. There has been no let up on the learning in our class! In English, we have applied our knowledge of speech and our class text to write wonderful newspaper reports. In maths, we have recapped several areas of misconception highlighted in the NFER summative assessment papers. These include, ordering and comparing fraction, reflecting and translating shape, rounding decimals and area and perimeter. In RE we concluded our study of Umma (community) by summarising what we think the positives and negatives of a global community are. In computing, we continued to create our multi step quiz and in history we concluded our study of the Ancient Egyptians by showing off all the knowledge learned. However, my highlight of the week was our DT. The children worked incredibly hard to finish making their Egyptian style death masks and they look incredible! Well done year 5 for a busy week.



WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Year Six we have been working hard and enjoying the warm weather! The two sports days took up a good portion of our week, with the Year Sixes doing a fantastic job at organising and running the KS1 carousel of activities and supporting the races too. They devised the field activities themselves, explained their group's activity and demonstrated it each time, and then ensured everything ran smoothly and supported the younger children in their tasks. What a great demonstration of their growing independence and maturity; we were very proud. In addition to refining our Leavers plans, we have also been wrapping up some different topics from earlier this term. In history, the children compared and contrasted the roles that Harriet Tubman and Rosa Parks played at different times in progressing Black Civil Rights in America. In French, we learned some prepositions (sur, sous, dans) so we could write about where different household objects could be found. The children are doing so well to keep on working as the term nears its end and the weather warms up - keep up the great attitudes right until the end please, Year Six!
