I cannot believe we only have a week left of this half-term. Our Reception class in particular have settled so well and have really adapted to life in school. It has also been wonderful to welcome some new pupils too into the school community. I am hopeful we will have all our staff back next half-term so that we can resume some of the things we have had to put on hold over the last few weeks. **Clubs** will run for just 4 weeks next half-term with a start date of Monday 11th November, however, please note that performance club will be held on Monday 4th November as the children already signed up for this will continue. We are mindful that chess clubs was cancelled a few weeks ago and that children attending PJs and Popcorn next week will not attend club. We will ensure that you receive a credit against your child's next club in lieu of these missed sessions. A new club list will be sent out after half-term. Please discuss with your child that they must be fully committed to the clubs they sign up for as we must have the full payment for any paid clubs, thank you.

Talking of **PJs and Popcorn**, we are really looking forward to this next Thursday. I am sorry but we cannot accept any late payments now. Children in Reception and Key Stage 1 must bring their PJs or Halloween outfit in a named bag to change into after school.

Thank you so much for all your support with our **'Go Yellow'** events today to support Mountbatten. We have put all the money raised into a sealed Mountbatten collection tin and will be notified soon how much we have raised and I will ensure I share this information with you. Thank you to the older children in School Council for organising the sweets in the jar guesses. The number of sweets was 107 with Max in Year 6 having the closest guess of 109 sweets, he won the jar!

On Tuesday 12th and Thursday 14th November we will be holding our **parents evenings** for you to come and meet your child's teacher. This is a really important meeting to hear how your child has settled but also to receive your child's targets for this term. Please sign up for a session as soon as possible. Lists will be put up on classroom doors to book a time, Year 6 parents can call the office as we appreciate the children tend to walk to school on their own now.

The **scholastic book fayre** will also be open during the parents evenings for your to have a look and purchase any books you may like. Please note there is no obligation to purchase a book.

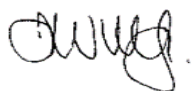

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have had such a busy week in Reception class. The children continue to learn a new sound each day and this week we learned what a 'diagraph' was! The children are having the opportunity to do some simple blending and they really are trying so hard to read words. In maths we have been counting with some 'evil peas' from our text Supertato. The children were given a number and then had to count out the corresponding number of peas! We have focused on number formation as well and had lots of practice writing number 3 as this was tricky to form. The children have had lots of fun using the playdough to make animals and gingerbread people. Well done everyone.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Thank you so much to all the grown-ups who were able to join us on Thursday to share the children's work and help them with their cutting skills to make a delicious fruit salad! The class loved having you all in and were keen to share their hard work since starting year one. In Maths this week, we continued to work on partitioning numbers, using tens frames to help us. We also solved some problems involving partitioning and began to practice counting in tens. In English we focused on using full stops at the end of each sentence. The children wrote some fantastic sentences, using finger spaces and full stops, plus fixing some sneaky mistakes Miss Paterson had made in her sentences. In Geography we looked at a map of a different school and compared it to our school. We thought about the human and physical features of both schools. In RE we continued our learning about celebrations. We discussed how we celebrated harvest as a school and thought about how Christians celebrate it too. One more week of fun-filled learning to go!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in English, we looked at using adverbs to describe. The children write from sentences about Traction Man, using adverbs to bring the writing alive for the reader. We then planned a new story about Traction Man, but set in our classroom. We have to find objects around the room and make them into exciting characters. We had Super Glue, Horrible Book, Evil Red Card. On Friday, we began to write our new stories, using the adverbs discussed earlier on in the week. Next week we will be finishing off these stories, ready to read them to our grown ups at the parent share on Wednesday.

In Maths we have looked at money. The class first worked on recognising coins. We then moved onto making amounts of money using different coin combinations. We used our learning on counting in 10s, 5s and 2s to help us work out how many 10p, 5p and 2p we would need to make the same amounts. This was a really tricky concept to start with, but after a couple of lessons, we really got the hang of it and were able to apply it independently.

In Science we built upon our previous lesson where we tested materials. We used the material we selected last week and made a tent from Traction Man. As a class, we came up with some questions that we wanted to find the answers to during this investigation. We then left our tent outside overnight in the wind and rain to see what happened. When we revisited the next morning, our tent was still up and it had been kept under the tent dry. The only problems we found was that because the tent had a flat roof, a big collection of water had gathered. Next time, we decided that we would make our tent have a pointed roof.

Another great week! Well done Year 2!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have had another fun week in year 3. In English this week, we have been looking at how to write acrostic poems about characters' from the BFG and incorporating alliteration and similes into them. We also spent time rehearsing and performing them to each other. In maths, we have spent the week exploring measurement in millimetres, centimetres and metres, but looking at perimeters and using their knowledge of measurement to do so. We also tackled some measurement word problems. In geography we used the iPads to research the difference between major capital cities and discussed where we'd rather live and why. During our French lesson, the children continued to practice greetings and to ask/tell people how they are feeling through some fun games and activities. In music, we did some brilliant listening, analysing and performing! Well done year 3!

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week has been very busy! In English, we have begun The Sword in the Stone, and have been using extracts and clips of the classic Disney film to support us with our writing. We are focussing on fronted adverbials and direct speech and will use these skills to create our own newspaper reports next week. In Maths, we have been recapping our addition and subtraction with exchanges using formal methods. In Science, we have been learning about volume, what it is and which material is the best insulator to lower volume. In RE, we recreated our own version of the parable 'The Good Samaritan' and making it relatable to modern day. On Thursday, we acknowledged World Mental Health Day by 'Taking Ten'. We discussed the benefits that reading can have on our mental health and took ten minutes to enjoy our books. Finally, in History, we learned all about King Alfred the great and compiled reasons as to why he was so great. Thanks Year 4!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In English this week, the children have been exploring the features of survival guides and what is included within these non-fiction texts. They enjoyed watching a video of Bear Grylls top tips and have begun to plan ideas for their own writing. Within maths, the children have recapped their understanding of multiples and will be moving onto looking at factors next. In geography, we learnt the meaning of trade (including import and export) within countries. The children then researched what Japan exports to the United Kingdom and the value of these goods. In computing, we explored what web crawlers are and how they work within searches. Then the week finished off with a lovely art activity where the children created a collage of Hokusai's Great Wave and an interesting Big Think question. Great week Year 5!

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week we have planned, written and edited our non-fiction texts in English. The children have tried to include a list, with whichever form of list punctuation they feel confident using, along with the usual organisational features such as subheadings. In maths, we have briefly revised multiplication, which the class were already mostly confident with, and dived into long division! This is always a challenging method to master, as there are lots of steps, but we have talked about the fact that the maths involved is actually not difficult (as long as you know your times tables!) so for those not feeling confident yet, don't worry as we just need more practice until that process is familiar. In history, we looked at the impact of Ancient Greek on our modern language and in art we enjoyed painting our clay plaques. Our science investigation was lots of fun, making dark spaces so we could measure shadows accurately. Results varied, but this helps us learn about anomalies and human error, which are important concepts to understand! In computing we have been enjoying some work on how to collaborate using technology, such as shared slideshows or joint projects on Scratch. We have also had a visit from a Cowes Enterprise representative, so now the children have heard about our three closest secondary schools.

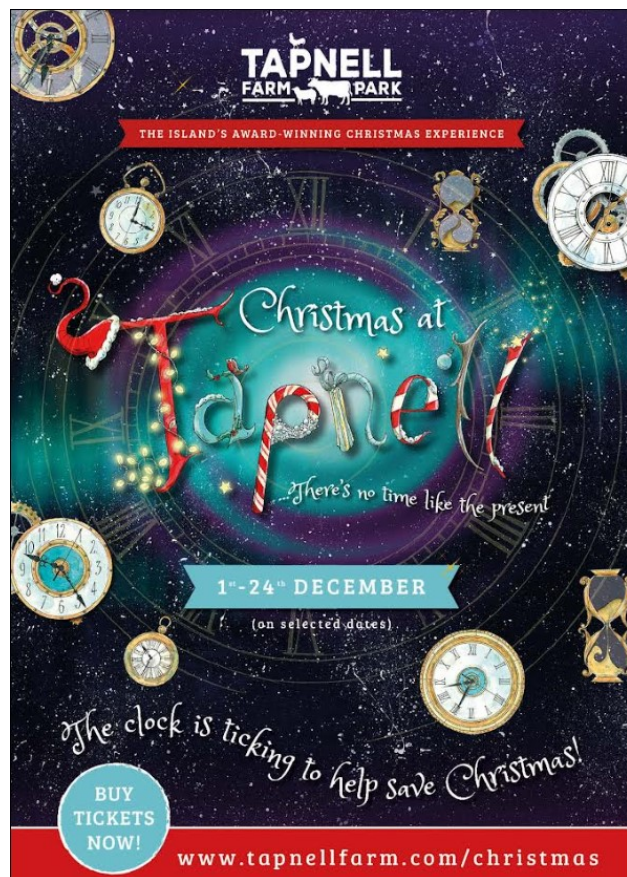
