Dear Parents/Carers,

What an amazing way to end our first term of this academic year with such a positive article in the Country Press following the release of our Ofsted report. We have been overwhelmed by the support we have received and I am so very proud of everyone, and in particular, the incredible commitment the staff team have.

It was a super last celebration **assembly** of the term today. We shared the **House Point totals** for the year and congratulated all the children in Asher-Smith House (red) who won first place with 1625 points. Second place was Farrell House (yellow) with 1525 points, third place Jones House (green) with 1475 points and fourth place was Stokes House (blue) with 1450 points. Asher-Smith House got an extra playtime as a reward this morning, well done all.

Summer: green and white striped or checked summer dress with white socks.

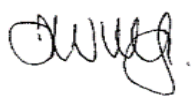
P.E. Kit: (in any named bag)

WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have had a lovely, fun and festive week in Reception class. We have been busy making our 'Candy cane' Christmas cards to send home to our families and our writing is attached inside. We have finished off some phonics assessments and have developed our fine motor skills a little further by collaboratively colouring in some festive pictures. On Wednesday we enjoyed the Christmas Dinner and for us it was our first experience of Christingle at the church on Thursday. To round off the week we enjoyed dancing and playing games on Friday. Well done to all our Reception children for completing their first term in school! Now to enjoy the holidays.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

In Maths this week we have been working on money. We learnt the different coins and their value, then ordered the coins from the lowest to highest value. We then set up a shop and used the coins to pay for items up to 20p. In English we have been practising writing words ending in -ing. We wrote a list of things Bob does for his job such as cleaning and jumping. Then we wrote a job advert for a Christmas elf who must be very good at wrapping and delivering toys! We finished our History topic by discussing why we remember Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus. The children have all remembered lots of information about both the explorers - well done! In Art we completed our space themed prints using balloons and marbled colours to represent different planets. We rounded off the week with a lovely Christingle service where the children sang beautifully, and a fun-filled Christmas party on Friday.

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We made it! Well done Year 2 for an absolutely brilliant first term! You've all worked incredibly hard and made us very proud.

This week we did a free write in English. The children pretended they were in the North Pole and had to write a letter to Mrs Wilford, telling her what they had been doing. They came up with some incredible ideas, including ice skating, drinking hot chocolate, fixing the wrapping machine and feeding the reindeer.

In Maths, we looked at reading and creating pictograms. We asked our class mates what their favourite toy was and showed the data we collected in a pictogram. The children really enjoyed this. In science, we had a challenge from Father Christmas. We had to design a new material to wrap presents. The class had to think back to all our prior learning and carefully consider what properties this new material needs. They all really enjoyed this challenged and did a great job!

I hope you all have an amazing Christmas and a well deserved rest! We look forward to seeing you in the New Year!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

What a great final week of 2024! Year 3 have worked hard to recap their knowledge of the three and four times tables in maths and have applied their learning well during our Christmas themed English week.

It has been a great term, with lots of new learning and developing in both confidence and maturity. I wish you all a wonderful Christmas and a happy new year!

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week, we have had a very exciting last week of term leading up to the Christmas break. In Maths, we have been continuing our work with fractions, adding two fractions with the same denominator together, and rounding decimals to the nearest whole number. In English, we completed our non-chronological reports ready for display, and the children have taken extra care to ensure they have been presented to a high standard. We completed our Science topic of living things and habitats by recognising natural and human factors causing environments to change, and how living things have adapted to these changes. This linked in to our Geography topic which concluded with the class identifying deforestation and climate change as two major threats to the rainforest. From this, we explored ways that humans could reduce the effects of these threats. Finally, it has been a very exciting week with all the festivities happening in school. The class performed beautifully for the church Christingle service and enjoyed creating their own Christingles. Today we had a great time celebrating together, and the children even had a very special person come and visit! Have a wonderful Christmas break Year 4 and a happy new year!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

First term complete and Year 5 have been amazing! In English this week, we have written a narrative inspired by The Highwayman and then had a go at creating some Christmas themed haiku and acrostic poems. Within Maths, the children impressed me with their understanding of coordinates, translations and reflections, which they applied to a range of festive problems. We concluded our Computing unit and it was great to see the children show their videos to the rest of the class. We also finished our learning in History, RE, PSHE and PE. Year 5 spent time carefully constructing their zoetrope's in DT, which they enjoyed watching spin to see their animations move. We had a lovely Christmas dinner and Christingle service, rounded off with a super fun party day and a visit from a special someone! I hope everyone has a fantastic, relaxing break; I look forward to seeing the children again and doing some great learning when we come back!

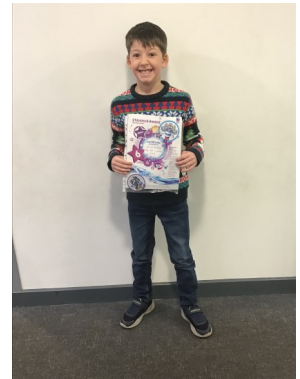
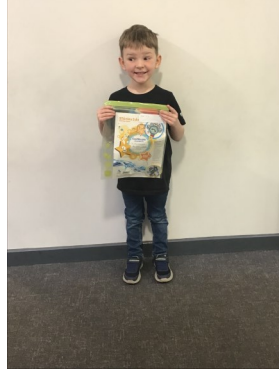
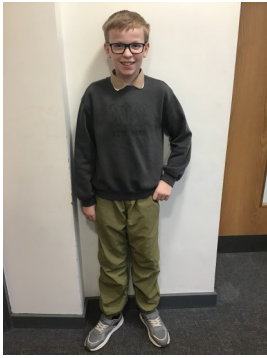

Young Inspectors 2025 - Does your child and young person with a disability and additional need between the ages of four to 19 years like working in groups, giving their thoughts and feelings, and being rewarded for their hard work as well as participating in free activities?
If yes this scheme could be for you!

The Short Breaks Young Inspector scheme is specifically designed to increase the involvement of children and young people with disabilities and additional needs.

Young Inspectors will be able to provide opinions and feedback to us on activities by participating, observing, and recording their views through completing our child-friendly questionnaire.

The aims of the programme will support:

- youth in receiving the best possible standards from services that work with them or have an impact on them
- children and young people participation in the Short Breaks service, empowering them to make their voices heard and needs met
- organisations and activity providers to use feedback for improvements provided by the Young Inspectors to support their service or activity becoming more inclusive and disability friendly
- Short Breaks continuing to work with the Young Inspectors and use the findings from the project as a reflective tool for improving best practice and implementing change in the future.

Rewarding Young Inspectors

Short Breaks values children and young people and families giving up your free time to be part of the Young Inspectors programme. As a result, Short Breaks have introduced an incentive scheme to thank you for all your hard work.

Benefits

We are aware of the benefits of being involved in a participation project like the Young Inspectors programme. Children and young people with disabilities and additional needs involved within the programme can expect to gain a range of valuable experiences and develop **valuable skills**, such as:

- working as a team
- communicating with others
- having fun
- sharing thoughts and providing solutions to issues
- building confidence.

Such skills and experiences can work towards individual educational achievement as well as supporting the development of this important service.

We offer you, as a Young Inspector, **vouchers of your choice** each time you are involved in the initiative. You will gain a Short Breaks stamp which represents a monetary value to go towards a £5 voucher for every inspection.

Vouchers can be claimed at the end of the annual programme which will be presented at a **Young Inspectors party**.
