Dear Parents,

I hope you had a super break and got the opportunity to enjoy the beautiful weather we had. It has been a short but busy week and it's wonderful to see all the children back and eager to learn. This half-term will fly by with it being so short and with another Bank Holiday ready for a long last half-term. We are working hard with our Year 6 in preparing them for their SATs in a few weeks as well as all staff planning some exciting learning opportunities for the last term of the school year. Our Reception children are now joining us at lunchtime as well as Celebration Assembly on a Friday, developing their confidence and preparation for transition to Year 1.

We are currently in the process of sorting **staffing** for the new school year but cannot put the final arrangement in place until after half-term, however, we will sadly be saying goodbye to a much valued member of staff. I am sure you are all aware of the budget constraints schools have with staffing being the largest part of any school budget. All schools now have children who require additional support but also staff deliver many more interventions to drive the expectations that are in place. Many, many more children now enter school with gaps in learning or delayed development and the profile of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities has greatly increased, not only at Wootton, but nationally. We are delighted that our inclusive provision was praised by Ofsted and is also recognised by many other professionals, however, the role of the SENCo has grown and we need to have a SENCo in school fulltime to support the increasing needs of children. We have had to look at our staffing structure and costings and we are moving to a model that many one form entry schools use in that the role of the SENCo will become part of the role of the Deputy Head, therefore **Miss Paterson** will be taking on this role from September. It is therefore with much sadness, that due to this change in structure, **Mrs Grimes** will be leaving us at the end of the summer term. I am sure many of you that have worked with Mrs Grimes over the years will agree that she will be leaving a big hole and she is disappointed that she cannot stay in post but recognises that the role and needs have grown. Mrs Grimes and Miss Paterson will work closely together this term to ensure there is a seamless transition ready for September.

Talking of transition, **Tuesday 8th July** will be our transition day with all children moving up to their new class and Year 6 attending Secondary school for the day. At 8.45 on the 8th, teachers will share information in their classroom for you to hear about your child's next year of learning with the chance for you to speak to your child's new team. More information will be sent soon.

Please don't forget to contact the office to confirm your attendance at the first MHST workshop on **Thursday 22nd May, 1.15-2.45pm**. There are several more sessions following this but attendance to the first one is required to access some or all of the subsequent sessions. Please see the poster attached for more information regarding the first session. The additional sessions are on 5th June, 12th June and 26th June all 1.15-2.45pm. In assembly today we congratulated several different achievements - Max in Year 6 continues to develop his skateboarding skills, winning another competition on the mainland, Patryk and Lexie in Year 3 shared their latest swimming awards, Zach in Year 4 took part in a rugby tournament, Jacob in Year 6 was named 'payer of the match' at a recent football game and Iommi in Year 6 shared her gymnastics medal where she was awarded 1st place. WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

We started our week by taking the opportunity to talk about our Easter holidays and say what our favourite activity was. It was wonderful to hear about all the fun things the children did during the break.

Following on from our discussion about the holidays the children were then asked to write a simple sentence about this. It was fantastic to see the effort that was being put in and the progress is brilliant, for some children they literally just wrote it by themselves!

Our new topic this half term is 'Pirates' so the children have been using the tough tray pirate world area and they have looked at some of the story books related to pirates. We will introduce more activities next week.

The children have all settled back into school well and for us we are thinking about the transition into Year 1 so our children have joined the main school for lunch time play which they have enjoyed.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We had an exciting start to the week boarding the Year 1 plane and travelling to the Sahara Desert then to Antarctica! We explored both of these places, finding out about the weather and the animals that live there. We also learnt about the seven continents and learnt a song to help us remember them. In English we read a new story 'Meerkat Mail' then thought of lots of adjectives to describe the main character. We wrote simple and compound sentences to describe what the meerkats were up to and also started learning about exclamation marks. We practised counting in fives in Maths and used 5p coins, Numicon and number lines to help. We solved some problems by counting in fives and then moved on to measuring mass, finding out how many cubes balanced the scales for different classroom objects. In Science we went for a walk around the school and looked for different animals. We made observations about the animals we saw and started to think about the differences between them. We continued our topic work in Art, sketching an Arctic landscape carefully, thinking about the different shapes and the learned how to create shades using colouring pencils to finish our scenes. In Computing we are starting to learn about the keyboard and worked hard to use a capital letter for our names. A super start to the term, well done everyone!

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Welcome back everyone!

We hope you all had a good Easter break and enjoyed the beautiful sunshine. Hopefully this weather will continue into the summer term!

Firstly, thank you so much for your support with reading over the school holidays and for the homework this week. The children were very excited to receive their first piece of homework - hopefully this eagerness continues into the future!

In English, we have started our new book, The Lost Happy Endings. This is a slightly longer and more complex book that we have done previously, but the children have so far really enjoyed it. This week we've focused on the beginning of the story and our main character Jub. The children have been describing Jub's important job and then create a set of instructions on how to carry out this job. The writing has been superb, with a huge effort from everyone in the class.

In Maths, we've focused on movement and measurement. To start the week, we looked at rotations. We focused on clockwise, anticlockwise, whole, half, quarter and three quarter turns. The class enjoyed being able to get up and practical with the activities for this learning. We then moved onto measuring in ml. To end this small unit, the children had to follow a recipe, measuring out different amounts of liquids to form the magic potion. This was great fun for all the class.

In Science, we started a new unit looking at living things. We started by having a scavenger hunt, finding things around school that fitted into three categories: alive, dead and never alive. We then thought about what makes something living and what the difference is between dead and never alive. Overall a brilliant week! Well done Year 2, keep up the fantastic work!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Welcome back to the third and final term of Year 3! This week the children have been introduced to their new topics. In English we will be focusing on the book - *The Wreck of the Zanzibar* by Michael Morpurgo (who is my favorite children's author). This week in English, the children have begun their study of the book by exploring diary entries from the point of view of the main characters. In Maths, we have recapped our understanding of place value and are learning how to solve missing number addition calculations to 1000 as well as learn how to measure and compare lengths in mm and cm.

Our new class lends itself nicely to our geography topic for this half term - land use and settlements. For this geography unit we will be exploring the question - How does land uses and settlements differ between rural and urban locations? The focus is a local area study of Brading and comparing what we learn to an urban setting (Southampton). For our first lesson, the children learned where Brading is on a digital map and explored some of the human and physical features there. In computing, the children will be introduced to programming and this week, we began to learn to use the program Scratch to create basic code. We have a wonderful and busy half term planned, and I look forward to sharing our learning journey with you as we progress.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

It has been a very busy first week back in Year 4! We have begun our topic for this half term which is World War 2, and in History, we have been understanding why the war began and who was involved. The class then created a timeline of these events. Continuing with this historical theme, we have been enjoying our new class book *'Friend or Foe'* by Michael Morpurgo. *'Friend or Foe'* tells the story of two evacuee boys, escaping the war and moving away from all they know, to the countryside. This has prompted lots of discussion among the class as they realise the harsh reality of children during this time.

In Maths, we have been continuing with a focus on multiplication and division, recalling our times table facts, finding the inverse and dividing a one-digit number by 10. In DT we have been learning about potential hazards in the kitchen in preparation for this half term's cooking unit where the children will get the opportunity to create carrot cookies. Finally, we have been learning *'Blackbird'* by The Beatles in Music, discussing the meaning of the lyrics and the significance the song had during the time of its release and today. Well done Year 4!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

It has been so lovely to see the children back and hear all about what they got up to during the Easter holidays! This week has absolutely flown by, with the children settling back into the routines and expectations for Year 5. In English, we are using the Titanium music video as a stimulus for writing, and the children have spent their lessons developing powerful setting descriptions for the first scene. They have carefully chosen prepositions and effective figurative language to enhance their descriptions to the reader. Within Maths, the class have learnt what square and cube numbers are, and practised applying their understanding to a range of problem solving and reasoning questions. The children have become secure with this learning quite quickly, so we will be moving on to recapping and consolidating the four operations next week. Year 5 have been introduced to their new topics in both Science and Geography, and the first lessons of these have hooked the children in. We had an especially fun Science lesson, where the class modelled the distance of the planets from the sun on a much smaller scale! In DT, the children began to explore frame structures, and RE saw them discussing the meaning of 'sacred'. A great first week back and lots of exciting things to look forward to this term!
