WHAT RECEPTION HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Reception class we have spent most of the week carrying out phonics assessments ready for the second part of the summer term. I have been really impressed at how hard the children worked and the fact they could apply their knowledge of digraphs and trigraphs to longer words. In Maths we have continued to look at odd and even numbers and on the carpet - the children have been able to explain what makes a number odd and what makes it an even number. The children have also enjoyed helping the staff set up our dinosaur area ready for next term.

WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We had a fantastic day at the Wildheart Animal Sanctuary on Monday! We had a guided tour and found out some really interesting information about the animals. The children answered lots of questions about the different types of animals, I was very impressed with how much they have remembered from our Science lessons - well done Year One! In English we made inferences about the character's feelings then the children wrote a letter in role explaining how Blue Penguin felt. The class also found out more about penguins and their habitat and wrote independent fact files to showcase their new knowledge. We learnt to name 3D shapes in Maths and thought about the differences between the shapes. The children made some 3D shapes and looked for different 3D shapes in the classroom. They also began to create patterns using 3-D shapes, beginning to describe their properties to find the mystery shape. We did some fieldwork in Geography linked to our topic of hot and cold countries. We predicted which areas of our school are hot/cold then used thermometers to find the hot and cold areas. We created a map to show our findings. In Art we created our own Gallery and evaluated the effect of our collage scenes compared to the work of the Artist John Piper. Finally in Computing we compared writing on paper to writing using the computer and thought about which jobs each method would be useful for. Keep practicing that typing, you have all done a super job!

Well done on a brilliant (though short!) half-term - we are looking forward to spending the final term of Year 1 together after the break :)

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Wow, this half term seems to have flown by!

Due to a couple of bank holidays and it being a shorter half term, we will be continuing to learn about the same topics for the first 2 weeks back in June.

In English, we started looking at a new book, The Tale of Two Beasts. This is a lovely story which tells the events from two different points of view. The children have really enjoyed the book and have planned and written a new innovated version, with their very own beast character. We've seen brilliant writing all of this half term, so a huge well done Year 2!

In maths, we have been looking at time. We have been learning to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes. The class were incredible with this, using their 5 times table knowledge to help them. Any practice of this over half term would greatly benefit the children!

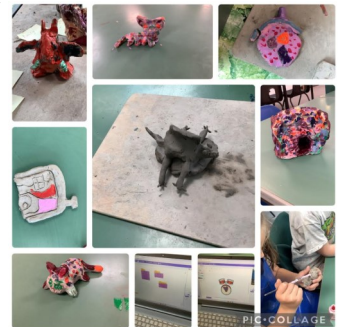
In History, we thought about how we know so much detail of the events before, during and after The Great Fire of London. We looked closely at the diary of Samuel Pepys and at some art work that was created at the time of the fire. We thought about the reliability to these sources and how things have changed over time.

A brilliant week to end the half term! I hope you have a lovely week off, ready for a rather lengthy final half term in Year 2!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

We have finished the half term in style! This week, the children finished their studies in several subjects. In English we concluded reading our class text - The Wreck of the Zanzibar and I am so glad the majority of the class enjoyed learning from this book. We ended the unit by writing a persuasive letter to the government, asking for aid after the winter storms destroyed so much. In Maths, we have recapped time - something which is notoriously challenging to master. The children have worked extremely hard to improve their understanding of time. Please continue to practice telling the time at home to cement their understanding. In computing, the children finished their first coding unit by creating, and coding, their own music concert. In RE, we compared features of several different places of worship including: a church, mosque and synagogue. We then were able to answer the question: Why are places of worship special? However, my highlight of the week was art. Over the last two weeks the children have designed and sculpted their own Gaudi inspired building and creature.

I hope you have a wonderful half term break and I look forward to a productive end to the academic year!



WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Wow! Where did that half term go? For our final week in Year 4, we have been concluding our WWII topic and we finished the week by completing our class book "Friend or Foe" by Michael Morpurgo. The topic has certainly sparked a lot of interest among the class, and on Thursday, we made some delicious carrot cookies using our rationed food items which was an exciting end to our DT topic, and to a great half term.

We also completed our diary entries from the perspective of David from our class book, to give insight into his experience of discovering German airmen on British territory during the war. Bringing their diary entries to life, the children used informal language and conjunctions to expand on why David was feeling the way he was.

In Maths, we have been practicing our methods of addition and subtraction without using formal methods such as the column method. This has proved quite challenging for some of the class who excel using the column method, as they truly master the concept using numbers lines and partitioning. Finally, in Science, we have been having lots of fun with our electricity topic which we will continue next half term also. The children have been creating circuits and exploring each component, the effect of adding additional batteries to the circuit, switches and buzzers. Overall, it has been a very busy and fun-filled half term and I look forward to welcoming the class back for our final half term together in Year 4.

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

I cannot believe it is half term already!

We have had a lovely week in Year 5, finishing off our learning units across the curriculum. In English, the children completed writing their non-chronological reports based on their planet, and then created videos with their own voiceover. The class have worked extremely hard on these and they have been brilliant to read and listen to, well done Year 5! Within Maths, the children have been practising their multi-step problem skills, focusing specifically on choosing the correct operation to solve the questions. They are now very secure on their addition and subtraction methods, ready to consolidate their multiplication and division after half term. In computing, the class experimented with the learnt tools on slides to create a vector drawing, and in PSHE, we explored what it means to be grown up. We also watched and participated in a live concert from the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra in music, and finished making our frame structures in DT. My highlight, however, has to be our sailing session which we received great feedback from the instructors on. They said that the children's attitudes, listening and perseverance was brilliant, especially when some fell off the boats! The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves again this week, and we are excited for our last two sessions next term.
