Yesterday we had a wonderful time at **Church** where every child performed so well with their class. Thank you so much to all the parents who supported the walk there and back but also thank you for all the lovely feedback, in particular that the children's good behaviour was so recognised.

The **disco** was such great fun, thank you to the parents from PTA who helped set up and run this with the staff, the children really had great fun.

Thank you to the parents who have given their time to support school council with their activities this afternoon. Thank you for all the wonderful donations of sweets and chocolate - the tombola is going to be very busy!

These events would not go ahead without the support of the PTA and parent volunteers but in particular Amy, Rueben and Jessica's mum, we need to be very grateful for as she gives so much of her own time to source and organise the things we need to make for the events run so well. So thank you to everyone for their help but an **extra big thank you to Amy!**

It was a great last **Celebration Assembly** of the term this morning hearing about our Star Pupils. We heard about the incredible football success over the last week (please see the sports news for more information) as well as congratulating Louis in Year 4 for his participation in a rugby tournament, Jake also in Year 4 has been awarded the 6th KYU in karate, Tilly in Year 2 shared 2 gymnastics certificates and Marley in Year 1 shared his swimming certificate, well done everyone.

We also presented Sonny S and Jack in Year 2 with a special certificate each for completing the whole of the Numbots program and gave Jamie in Year 1 and Patryk in Year 4 their reading certificates. We also celebrated the **winning House** for this term - Jones House (green) with 245 points, Farrell House (yellow) in 2nd place with 2375 points, Stokes House (blue) with 2175 points and Asher-Smith House (red) with 2100 points. We enjoyed deciding who's story we believed the most and why. In our writing we focused on using the conjunction 'and'. We used our learning from last week and write sentences describing the wolf using 2 adjectives.

In maths we looked at recalling our number facts to 20. We were blown away by the speed and fluency of the class. This has been a whole class target since the beginning on Year 1 and the hard work has definitely paid off!

In Art, we designed fairy tale houses to be made out of clay. After half term, we will be continuing this art topic and creating our houses whilst learning some new modelling techniques.

A big thank you to everyone that could make it to our Spring craft afternoon. The children all had a great time, and it was lovely to see everybody working together and helping each other with the different activities.

WHAT YEAR 2 HAVE BEEN UP TO

It has been a very jam-packed week in Year 2! The children have been working incredibly hard on their assessments, and I have been so proud of their focus, determination and positive attitudes throughout. As a special creative treat, Karen from Aspire visited to challenge the class to design their own rubber ducks, and later in the week she returned with some exciting prizes. The children also thoroughly enjoyed Thursday's mufti day and disco, which brought lots of smiles and excitement to the week. Earlier that day, we visited the church where the children were fantastic, confidently performing their Easter song and representing the school so beautifully. We ended the week on a high with our craft afternoon. What a wonderful and busy week it has been. Have an amazing 2 weeks off Year 2!

WHAT YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Good afternoon, I will keep this week's entry short and sweet. Well done to each and every child in Year 3. This has definitely been a very successful term. I can't really pick our one main highlight as there were so many. The final swimming and music sessions were fantastic. Our poetry performance in the Church on Thursday was wonderful and the I am incredibly proud of the maturity everyone showed during our assessment week too.

I hope you all have a wonderful Easter break and I look forward to welcoming you back to our final term together!

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

I am immensely proud of the children this week as they have completed assessments in our core areas of learning. They have applied their knowledge and skills so well and have even had a go at answering the questions they weren't 100% sure of by approaching problems calmly and logically. I look forward to sharing their achievements and next steps with you during parents evening. One thing that really stood out for me was how the children's times table knowledge is being applied in so many different ways (counting sequences, with fractions and to solve various problems). In English, most of the children have completed and edited their narratives in role as a water droplet on the theme of the water cycle. They have worked hard to structure their writing into topic paragraphs and apply the rules of speech. We have now finished our 'freedom' topic in RE by revisiting Passover and evaluating the importance of freedom for the Jewish community. In geography, we looked at examples of flood management systems located both here on the Island and along the Amazon River in South America. I know the children who attended the disco had a fantastic evening and we were delighted to host some of you in class for our Spring craft activities. I wish you all a peaceful and hopefully sunny Easter break, and I look forward to seeing the children back at school in April, ready for our final term!

WHAT YEAR 5 HAVE BEEN UP TO

Wow, I cannot believe the Spring term is over already! The children have really impressed me with their focus and effort during our NFER practise tests this week, of which they have had to complete six! After marking them, I can see a lot of progress has been made and we will use these to help their learning progress even further by recognising common mistakes. Outside of assessments, we have had a super last week, getting many units finished off. Computing saw the class using a real-life database to find different flights, whilst in science, they learnt about the life cycle of amphibians. We spent a lot of time this week practising our song for the Easter service, and the children made me very proud when they confidently performed it to the school at the Church! Have a well-deserved break, Year 5, and come back ready for lots of exciting activities during the summer term. Happy Easter!

WHAT YEAR 6 HAVE BEEN UP TO

This week in Year Six we have been writing narratives in English. The children did a wonderful job showing off their super dialogue skills, and then after some reminders about description they were able to include some longer descriptive passages to help their reader picture the scene. In maths, we worked on algebra and the children learned more about forming equations. Some really tricky maths was tackled, so well done all! We concluded our geography topic with some work on the anti-earthquake and sustainability measures in place in California, and in science we applied our learning about classification to figure out what kind of creature a platypus is! In art, the children produced some lovely drawings of various sweet treats inspired by Wayne Thiebaud, applying their work on colour, shadow and 'draw what you see, not what you think you see'. We have made some time at the end of term to enjoy the film adaptation of our class text, Wonder, which is a well-deserved treat after how hard everyone has worked this half-term. Next half-term will be another busy one, with four weeks of teaching followed by SATs week and then residential. Over the Easter holidays, please encourage your child to spend some time keeping up with their revision pack, so that their learning stays fresh in their memories. And enjoy the sunshine, which will hopefully make an appearance!
