I cannot believe we are here - the **end of the school year**, and what a fantastic year it has been! As I reflect on this school year I am overwhelmed with the enormity of all the incredible achievements we have had and all of this is down to the incredible staff team and whole school community. Thank you for all your support over the year, for your suggestions and feedback and on behalf of all the staff thank you so much for all your generous gifts and cards. It is at times like this that we all acknowledge, despite being exhausted, how lucky we are to work at Wootton.

Thank you for all your incredible support at the **summer fair** last Friday, we were overwhelmed with the amount of help that arrived on the day! Taking out our expenses the event made a profit of £873.06 which we will add to the PTA balance enabling us to now purchase an **outside classroom**.

Thank you for all the contributions to the recent **school uniform survey**. We took the results to the governors on Monday to discuss. The results were very mixed with no clear outcome so for this next academic year we are offering that children in Reception and Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) are able to wear a **BOTTLE GREEN polo** shirt IF they want to, **white will remain in place for Key Stage 2**. PE tops will be the school logo white T-shirt or a plain white T-shirt. We are also going to introduce a BOTTLE GREEN sports top this year. This **MUST** be plain and not have any brand or sports logos on it. Plain black shorts and trainers are to be worn with the PE top. Over the next academic year we will hold another consultation with uniform samples for you to look at with the intention to change the uniform for September 2027.

It has been such a busy last week too, thank you for coming along to our sports afternoons and for respecting my instructions regarding taking photographs. Due to an exceptional safeguarding requirement photos cannot be taken and shared if they have other children in other than your own. The **winning House for the sports cup** this year is Farrell House (Yellow) with a total of 3371 points, closely followed by Jones House (Green) with 3314 points, followed by Stokes House (Blue) with 3175 and fourth place Asher-Smith House (Red) with 3149. Well done to Mr Billington and Year 6 for all their hard work.

Talking of sport, we have been awarded the **Platinum Schools Games Mark** this year in recognition of our inclusive and high level of participation over the last year. In order to achieve this, we have had to meet the Gold criteria for the last 5 years so it is such wonderful news to obtain platinum this year. Thank you to Mr Billington in particular for ensuring that the children have had access to some incredible sporting events this year.

In our last and very busy **Celebration Assembly** today we congratulated our Star Pupils along with achievements outside of school. Well done to Toby in Year 3 who showed his football trophy and medal; Clara in Year 3 shared her cubs badges; Maggie in Year 2 shared her swimming certificates; George F in Reception shared his cricket medal and Ruben and Lauren from Reception shared their dance achievements. Two Bronze and three diamond reading certificates were awarded along with 18 books awards to the top readers in each class, all having read at least 250 times over the school year!

We also presented the **House Point cup** to Jones House (Green) with a total of 6955 points for the year, 2nd place was Asher-Smith House (Red) with 6607 points, 3rd place was Farrell House (Yellow) with 6060 points and 4th place Stokes House (Blue) with 6023 points. Well done to all the children over the year for earning all the House Points.

We thought it was going to be a goodbye to Miss Roberts too but she will be staying with us a little longer.

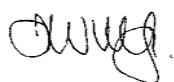
Whilst I don't want to wish the summer break away, I just need to mention a **few things for September**.

WHAT YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN UP TO

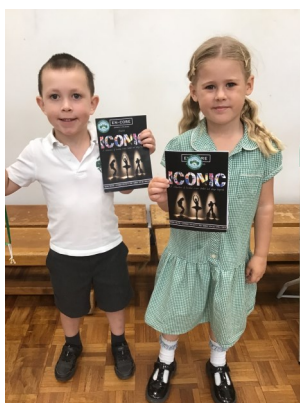

After finding out about the different strengthening techniques that engineers use to make earthquake-proof buildings, the children designed and made their own structural models to see which could withstand an earth tremor (otherwise known as shaking the table!) I'd like to congratulate all the children on their sports day performances! Their energy and enthusiasm were amazing, and I especially liked the way they encouraged and supported each other. Finally, thank you for all your engagement and support during my first year teaching at Wootton.
